SCHOOL

Independent Roman Catholic school for boys grades 7-12, located three miles west of Morristown. Sponsored by the Benedictine monks of St. Mary's Abbey. Accredited by Middle States Association, NJ Dept. of Education, member NAIS, NJAIS, NCEA; recipient of CASE Exemplary School Award. 648 Students; Faculty: 4 Benedictine monks and 99 lay teachers. 81 are full-time members, with 73 holding advanced degrees.

CURRICULUM

Semester system. Required: 4 credits English; 4 credits Mathematics; 4 credits Theology; 3 credits History, 3 credits World Language (French, Spanish, Latin, Italian, and Arabic); 3 credits Science; 1 and 3/4 credits Fine Arts; 1/4 credit Computer Science. AP courses in all subjects. 95% have taken one or are taking at least one AP course; 50% have taken or are taking two or more. Typically, students are not permitted to take more than three AP courses per year without permission.

GRADING

All grades are included in the GPA. Grade point averages are computed on assigned values of A+ = 4.33 or (97 - 100), A = 4.0 or (93 - 96), A- = 3.66 or (90 - 92), etc. Passing and college recommending is D = 0.66 or (65 - 69). Honors = 3.50 average. High Honors = 3.83 average. Highest Honors = 4.00 average. Advanced courses are weighted one-half additional value and Advanced Placement courses are weighted one whole additional value in determining GPA. Delbarton does not rank students.
