#### Screen at 3

Early Childhood Screening is required by the state of Minnesota for all children prior to entering kindergarten.

The best age at which to screen is age three. White Bear Lake Area Schools provides this screening at no charge.

#### **Building Construction Updates**

Since 2019, when the community supported a bond referendum, the list of completed facilities projects has grown to include the South Campus gym addition, Transportation Facility, ALC security renovation, and elementary additions at Lincoln, Matoska, Vadnais Heights and Willow Lane.

Phase 2 is in progress and includes work at Birch Lake, Lakeaires and Otter Lake Elementaries, ALC, and the addition at the current WBLAHS - South Campus, which will be a middle school building when North Campus becomes the site of the unified high school in the fall of 2024. In Hugo, the new North Star Elementary is open for students this fall and construction will begin at Oneka Elementary. Projects in the design phase include Central Middle School and Sunrise Park Middle School site's conversion to become a multi-use facility to include District Offices, Early Childhood, Transition Education Center (TEC) and the Senior Program.

#### **Attendance Boundaries Process**

The White Bear Lake Area Schools attendance boundaries are changing in two phases over the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years. The change was made necessary in part by the comprehensive facilities plan that was facilitated in order to accommodate student enrollment and best utilize new/expanded facilities.

#### District-wide Hires

#### **Lincoln Elementary Principal**

Brian Morris, who recently served as Hugo Elementary principal, is the new principal at Lincoln Elementary. Prior to beginning his principalship at Hugo during the 2019-20 school year, Morris was the district's assessment coordinator for six years. Before stepping into roles in administration, he worked for 17 years as a mathematics teacher, teacher leader and curriculum leader at White Bear Lake Area High School - South Campus.



#### North Star Elementary Principal

Principal Dan Schmidt begins his tenure this fall as principal at the district's new North Star Elementary, newly built in Hugo as part of the district's comprehensive facilities plan. Schmidt previously served as principal at Lincoln Elementary since 2006. Schmidt previously served in principal roles in North St. Paul-Maplewood-Oakdale and Sartell/St. Stephen's School Districts. He began his career teaching fifth grade at White Bear's Lincoln Elementary in 1990.



#### Sunrise Park Middle School Assistant Principal

Ryan Clark is the new associate principal for Sunrise Park Middle School. The position opened when AP Norman Bell accepted a principal position at St. Anthony-New Brighton High School. Clark has worked in the White Bear Lake Area School District since 2014. He has been a Health, Phy Ed and DAPE teacher and an instructional coach. He previously served as Sunrise Park's dean of students.



#### Sunrise Park Middle School Dean of Students

Lonal Van is starting this fall as dean of students at Sunrise Park Middle School, a position that became available when former Sunrise dean of students Ryan Clark became the assistant principal. During the last ten years, Van has worked for the Minneapolis Public School District. The new dean of students has experience in the classroom teaching fourth grade and in serving as a middle school dean.



#### White Bear Lake Area High School - North Campus Assistant Principal

Joe Held, who for the past two years has served as the dean of student success/BARR coordinator, will serve in an interim associate principal position while partnering with interim BARR and mentor Amanda Schroeder. Current associate principal Dion Harriman's duties will shift to include an oversight role in the unified high school building project, while continuing to fulfill some AP duties including facilities, scheduling and observations.

Later this fall, community members will see a capital projects levy renewal question on the November ballot. Renewing this investment, last approved by the community in 2013, puts a variety of educational tools, from classroom technology to books to musical instruments, into the hands of students. This funding also allows us to address equipment needs in the areas of safety and security, and transportation.

The straight renewal of the levy is projected to generate \$2,590,309 annually for an additional 10 years beginning in 2024, with the tax rate for district property owners remaining unchanged.

The funds will be used in the following ways:

- **Safety and security:** The capital projects levy allows the district to maintain and increase safety and security measures and equipment throughout the district.
- Technology and related services: The capital
  projects levy allows the district to provide classroom
  technology, software and computers for students. Related
  services include the maintenance of equipment and
  technology staff.
- Textbooks, curriculum materials and equipment, and musical instruments: The capital projects levy allows the district to purchase textbooks, curriculum materials and equipment, and musical instruments according to our curriculum replacement cycle.
- **Transportation:** The capital projects levy allows the district to purchase buses and vans for student transportation.

I look forward to continuing the conversation about the district's capital projects levy renewal, as we hope community members learn all they can about the renewal. I will be visiting with community groups this fall, and public meetings will take place at the following times as well:
