Dear New and Returning Falcon Students and Families!

The 2022-23 school year starts on Wednesday, August 31 for all freshmen and NEW to WHS 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> graders. ALL students attend starting Thursday, September 1. To help our students and families prepare, we invite and welcome ALL students to attend Falcon Days on August 25 (seniors and juniors) or August 26 (freshmen and sophomores) on a last name arrival schedule! We are pleased to provide you with preliminary information to help with your summer planning!

Falcon Days was developed as an all-in-one-day opportunity to provide communication, as well as an efficient back to school process that helps our students and families have the best possible start to the new school year. At Falcon Days, students will have the opportunity to:

- Obtain preliminary class schedules and other key information;
- Have their photo taken and receive their free, required student ID card;
- Pay for ASB memberships, sports participation fees, pre-approved student parking hangers, PSAT exam fees, and PTSA membership, as well as return items and/or pay fines;
- Purchase yearbooks (pre-sold ONLY Aug 24-26, Aug 31-Sept 16, and Nov 28-Dec 16).
- Learn about activities and clubs;
- Pick up or turn in medical forms or medications; and
- Seniors will receive their current transcript for review.

We look forward to assisting and seeing our new and returning students at Falcon Days! Masks are optional.

### **School Meals & Lunch Accounts**

The Northshore School District, like all others in the state, will again begin to charge for school lunch and breakfast at the start of the 2022-23 school year. The Federal COVID-19 waivers that have allowed U.S. public schools to offer free breakfasts and lunches to all students regardless of expired. This means students who apply for benefits and qualify for free or reduced-priced meals will continue to receive meals at no charge in 2022-23, and students who do not apply for or qualify for benefits will be charged at the paid meal price for breakfast and lunch when participating. What can you do to prepare?

- Reapply for benefits in August! The online application can be found here: <a href="https://family.titank12.com/application/new?identifier=BWCPTM">https://family.titank12.com/application/new?identifier=BWCPTM</a>. Students need to qualify each school year for free or reduced-priced meals in order to continue receiving benefits. More information on page 12 of this Newsletter.
  - In addition to meals, those who qualify can also receive discounted or free school services including athletic fees, field trip fees, ASB fees, college application fees, and more!
- If you haven't already, be prepared for purchasing meals by opening a Titan Family Portal account at <a href="https://family.titank12.com">https://family.titank12.com</a> where you can add money to your student's account, set up recurring payments, see purchases, set low-balance reminders, move money between siblings and even apply for benefits once available in the month of August.

During the school year, parents/guardians can also make prepayments into their student's lunch accounts by delivering cash or a check payable to NSD or WHS directly to the WHS Kitchen in the Commons. <u>Please note:</u>

- · Cash or checks received at the WHS Kitchen right up until lunch begins and throughout both lunches will be applied at that time
- Fees are not charged when a family pays by cash or check at WHS
- The student's ID number should be included with all payments
- The school district does not accept credit card payments via the food service phone number or at WHS
- You can view your student's meal account balance with TITAN at <a href="https://family.titank12.com">https://family.titank12.com</a>.

Students will continue to have a nutrition break during "Options" at WHS.

# **District Core Learning Service Applications & Devices**

### Clever & Schoology

Students and staff will continue with the use of *Schoology* accessed through *Clever* at <u>my.nsd.org</u> for distribution of <u>class</u> <u>assignments and learning materials</u>. New Parents and guardians will receive an email invitation from Clever. Please follow the instructions in that email to activate your account. *StudentVUE* and *ParentVUE* are the application for <u>checking grades</u> and for access to class schedules, report cards, course history, graduation status, near real-time information on attendance, and more. New students, parents, and guardians will have access to StudentVUE and ParentVUE <u>starting August 31</u>.

### School2Home Device Distribution

Students enrolled during the 2021-22 school year kept their device and will use that device for the 2022-23 school year. Devices for students new to Northshore and WHS will be distributed after school starts. The logistics of device distribution for new students will be forthcoming, along with a Student Use Agreement that the district will requires to be signed by parents/guardians prior to distribution. Students will be expected to bring their district-issued device to school, while school is in session, to use it during the school day. Families should make their best effort to take good care of the device, including keeping it safe when not in use, protecting the screen from scratches or cracks, and using the device only for appropriate academic use. Prior to the start of the school year, students should make sure they charge their device fully and locate all accessories well in well in advance of school starting so they are ready to go! (*It is strongly recommended that students use a district device instead of their own*. Personal devices can be difficult to troubleshoot and a liability if something goes wrong. Plus, there might be applications that can only be accessed on NSDPrivate which is limited to district devices.)

### Access ParentVUE to View Grades/Attendance/Student Details

**ParentVUE** is a web-based application that provides parents and guardians with information regarding their student via a secure website.

- **ParentVUE** allows parents and guardians to view grades including grades for specific assignments. Please consult with your students' teacher(s) for more information on the specific reports they post.
- Students access their information via *StudentVUE*, a separate web-based application, and are provided with their own username and password. Parents/Guardians must not share their login information to their ParentVue account with their student, as ParentVUE accounts afford parents/guardians with the ability to change their demographic and contact information.

The link to *ParentVUE* can be found on the WHS homepage at <u>woodinville.nsd.org</u> under "Resources". Parents and guardians are provided with an **Activation Key** to then establish their username and password. If a parent/guardian has more than one student, this login information will provide access to all of their students throughout NSD. <u>Usernames and passwords for *Leota Middle School and Timbercrest Middle School students remain the same* and carry forward to Woodinville High School.</u>

#### Where do parents/guardians new to WHS obtain their ParentVUE Activation Key?

If you are a parent/guardian who is new to WHS and need an Activation Key to establish a username and password to access **ParentVUE** there are two options:

- 1. Appear in person at the WHS Attendance Office, show ID, and pick up the Activation Key or
- 2. Send an <u>email request</u> with your student's name to whsattendance@nsd.org requesting the information. The email address will be confirmed and the information will then be emailed to the parent/guardian.

We apologize for the inconvenience; however, Activation Keys cannot be provided verbally over the phone due to the sensitivity of the information involved.

#### Forgot your ParentVUE username and password?

Once a parent/guardian establishes a username and password, WHS does not have access to it. If lost, parents/guardians should follow the prompts on the *ParentVUE* site to recover it or email whsattendance@nsd.org to request a password reset.

# Access TOUCHBASE to Make Online Payments, View Account Balance & Payment History

**TouchBase** is a web-based application that provides parents and guardians with the ability to **make payments online** and view their student's account balance and payment history 24hours a day, 7 days per week. In-person payments of cash, checks, and debt/credit cards are accepted at the Cashier's Office and Main Office during school days, 7:50 a.m. – 3:50 p.m., however, online payments continue to be encouraged to reduce possible COVID transmission.

The link to make online payments at TouchBase can be found on the WHS homepage at <u>woodinville.nsd.org</u> under "Resources>Payments". Like ParentVUE, where parents and guardians check student grades, <u>usernames and</u> <u>passwords for Leota Middle School and Timbercrest Middle</u> <u>School students remain the same and carry forward to</u> <u>WHS</u>. If a parent/guardian has more than one student, the TouchBase login information will provide access to all of their students' accounts.

**Parents and guardians in need of their <u>assigned</u> <b>TouchBase** *username and password* **should contact the Attendance Office at whsattendance at nsd.org.** We are unable to provide the information over the phone due to the sensitive nature of the information.

# Download the District Mobile App

WHS families are encouraged to download the District's Mobile App. It's free from the App Store or Google Play (works only on Android or iOS devices). Just search for "Northshore School District."

Here are just a few of the things you can do with it:

- Follow our school calendar and easily add events directly to your device calendar.
- Look up our staff contact information under Woodinville High School in the Schools Directory.
- Check our school menu.
- Pay for meals through a link to PayPams.
- Follow our school to receive news and notifications.

If you log in, you can also check information about your student(s), such as grades, classes, attendance, cafeteria balance, checked-out library books, bus stop times -- and set alerts for some of these.

Families are encouraged to set up or update their ParentVUE accounts now -- if they haven't already -- to be able to access student information in the mobile app.

To make online payments and/or check your student's payment history, parents will continue to log into <u>TouchBase</u> with their TouchBase user name and password.

# STUDENT ON-CAMPUS PARKING

**Beginning Monday, September 12, students must have a valid WHS 2022-2023 parking hanger in their car to park on the WHS campus**. Students are strongly encouraged to ride the school bus or carpool for space and environmental reasons. Parking hanger applications for the 2022-2023 school year opened at the end of last school year. The application is available online on the WHS website under 'Resources', 'Parking Permits' at https://woodinville.nsd.org/resources/parking.

**Payment** for students pre-approved to purchase a WHS parking pass can be made online through TouchBase accounts starting Wednesday, August. Payment in-person can be made during **Falcon Days, August 25 and 26** and then again once the cashier's office reopens on August 31 for the 2022-23 school year. All fines must be paid before a parking hanger can be issued. Students who pay online should bring in their receipt of payment when picking up their parking hanger. Parking is limited and will close once all available hangers have been issued.

Students who do not have a parking hanger on September 12 must park on the street until the hanger is *purchased.* The cost of parking hangers is \$50 per year/\$20 per seasonal sport/activity (\$10 for spring season for 3-season athletes). Parking on the WHS campus is limited. The purchase of a parking hanger does not guarantee <u>students a parking space every day.</u> All parking is on a first-come, first-served basis in designated student parking areasPlease see the priority parking plan below.

#### The parking priority plan is as follows:

- Seniors with WANIC/Health Science/Running Start class where there is no district shuttle offered.
- Juniors with WANIC/Health Science/Running Start class where there is no district shuttle offered.
- Seniors who participate in after school sanctioned sports and pre-approved after school activities.
- Juniors who participate in after school sanctioned sports and pre-approved after school activities.
- Seniors who have waivers or work after school.
- Remaining seniors in the lottery.

### **ATTENDANCE HIGHLIGHTS**

Our student day is from 8:20 a.m. to 3:20 p.m. and WHS expects all students to attend school every day. Below are a few highlights of our attendance policy and procedures:

- Absences <u>must be</u> excused within three (3) school days of the absence or the absence will stay unexcused and result in progressive discipline. Absences will not be excused after the three (3) school day time frame.
- If a student misses more than 15 minutes of class, it is considered an absence.
- If a student has three (3) or more days of unexcused absences in a class, regardless of total number of absences, a conference with administration is needed.
- If a student requires an **early dismissal**, the student should come to the Attendance Office **before school or during Options** with a parent/guardian signed request. Phone call and email request for early dismissal are no longer allowed.
- Students who leave campus without the school receiving parent permission prior to the student leaving, will not be able to have the absence(s) excused afterwards and will receive discipline.
- Students who **arrive late to school** (both excused and unexcused) must check in at the Attendance Office for a pass before proceeding to class.

### **Medications & Immunizations**

- Anyone planning to keep medication with the nurse during the school year should be planning to have the "Authorization for Medication" form filled out and sent in before the first day of school. That form can be accessed from the Health Room page found on the WHS website under Resources or from the Health Services page on the Northshore School District website. (https://resources.finalsite.net/images/v1591733045/nsdorg/choiqxduyhrn0zrgjdzz/Medication-Authorization-Form.pdf)
- Students with Epi-Pens: All students who have epinephrine for a severe allergy are required to have a new Authorization for Medication filled out each year and proof of an Epi Pen and/or AuviQ on campus BEFORE the first day of school. Students are not legally allowed to be on campus if they do not have paperwork in place and an Epi Pen either in the Health Room and/or self-carried in a purse, gym bag or backpack. All medication orders, including Epi pen orders, must be renewed each school year. The "Authorization for Medication" form can be download from the WHS or Northshore School District website and must be delivered to the Health Room prior to the first day of school.
- ✓ Immunization compliance: Please register your student at MyIR.com and check the website to make sure your child's immunization profile is in compliance. Your child is legally required to be up to date with all immunizations. Please check the ParentVue site to verify that your child's immunization profile is in compliance. Contact your medical provider if you have any questions or concerns.

# **Dress Code**

WHS continually attempts to provide the best educational environment for our students, faculty, and staff. The student's attire is primarily the responsibility of the parents or legal guardians. The Northshore School District is responsible for assuring that student attire does not disrupt or interfere with the educational process, which includes the health, safety, and emotional well-being of all students. Student attire should not contribute to any hostile or intimidating atmosphere for students.

As families prepare clothing for school, please keep the following in mind:

**Students May Wear:** Religious headwear, other headwear\* must allow the face to be fully visible to school staff; Fitted\*\* pants, including leggings, yoga pants and "skinny jeans"; Pajamas, Ripped or distressed jeans/shorts that do not expose underwear; Tank tops, halter tops, and crop tops (including those with spaghetti straps); Sunglasses can be worn outside (Special approval is needed to wear sunglasses in the classroom setting for medical purposes).

\*Headwear is approved to be worn on campus during the school day unless it is a safety issue. Headwear includes, but is not limited to, hats, visors, bonnets, hoodies, etc. In all circumstances, teachers should attempt to accommodate students who choose to put on headwear.

\*\*The term "fitted" can best be described as form fitting garments that contour the body while providing coverage at the same time.

Students May Not Wear Clothing With: Violent language or images; Images or language that encourages the use of alcohol, tobacco, vaping, or the use of any other drugs; Images or language that depicts illegal activity or that creates a hostile environment (hate speech, gang/hate group affiliation, profanity, or pornography); Bathing suit tops, tube tops, or sports bras (unless worn underneath another approved article of clothing); Visible underwear or boxers; Masks\* and headwear that conceal the face (except for religious, medical, and/or health related purposes); Dangerous or sharp objects that could be

used as a weapon, spikes, etc.

\*Unless directed by state, county, or district officials

If a student is wearing attire that is in violation of the dress code policy, the student will be asked to change clothes and will be subject to progressive discipline as outlined in the WHS Student Handbook.

School Photos & ID Cards Photos taken at Falcon Days Aug 25-Picture Make-Up Day September 13



All students will have a WHS ID card picture taken. The WHS photo ID card is <u>free</u> of charge. If a student misses Falcon Days on August 25 or 26, picture make-up day is September 13. Retake day is set for October 20. Because the Student ID is used to verify identity for testing, sporting events, and school safety records, it is imperative that students do not alter their appearance with hats, face paint, temporary tattoos, or dark/heavy glasses, etc.

#### Need to Remove a NSD High School-Level Course Taken in Middle School During 2019-20 & Beyond?

With the passage of HB 1599, effective with the 2019-20 school year, high school credit and the letter grade earned is automatically applied to transcripts for high school-level courses completed in middle school unless the student/parent requested otherwise at that time.

- A student may make changes to the selection made in middle school up through the end of their junior (11th grade) year.
- Changes to this selection may not be made after that time.

These options are available only for high school-level courses taken in middle school beginning in the 2019-20 school year.

# PSAT/NMSQT – Wednesday, October 12 \*All Juniors & Sophomores Participate \*Optional for Freshmen



In our continued commitment to our students' college readiness and our ongoing improvement efforts, the <u>annual</u> <u>PSAT/NMSQT exam is scheduled to be administered to all juniors and sophomores at WHS on</u> Wednesday, October 12 with results being available in mid-December. The PSAT measures critical reading, math problem solving, and writing skills that are important for success in college and in other post-secondary pursuits and <u>is the qualifying test juniors must take</u> to enter the National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship program. The exam will be administered on-site during the course of the school day. <u>The \$18 fee is due Sept 9 for all juniors and sophomores</u> and will be posted directly to junior/sophomore TouchBase accounts by Wednesday, August 24. ### Freshmen & the PSAT/NMSQT: Registration & Payment Deadline Friday, September 9

Freshmen have the option to participate in the PSAT/NMSQT during the on-site October 12 testing window. Freshmen who have paid the \$18.00 exam fee online <u>through Total Registration</u> by Friday, September 9 will be registered and have an exam booklet ordered for them. Please note <u>there is no late payment window for freshmen</u> due to College Board ordering deadlines. No exceptions! The College Board's SAT exam will be administered during the school day at WHS on **Wednesday**, **October 12, 2022**. This test administration is <u>geared as an opportunity for seniors</u> to take the SAT while juniors and sophomores (and opted-in freshmen) take the PSAT exam. The SAT will also be offered at WHS on **Saturday**, **March 11, 2023**. The SAT is an admissions test widely accepted by U.S. colleges and many international colleges and universities. Scores show student strengths and readiness for college work. Some test-optional colleges no longer look at SAT test scores, others

will consider them if submitted. It is always best to check with each college directly for the latest admissions information.

Juniors and sophomores could potentially take the SAT instead of the PSAT on October 12; however, both juniors and sophomores are encouraged to take the PSAT as it **prepares students for the SAT** that will be available at WHS Saturday, March 11 or at other locations on future dates.\* Additionally, **juniors who do not take the PSAT** will not be entered into the National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship program.

# FALL ATHLETIC NEWS

### **SPORTS PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS ONLINE REGISTRATION thru FinalForms**

Athletics registration is done online through <u>FinalForms</u> (<u>https://northshore-wa.finalforms.com/</u>). Your information is saved from season-to-season and year-to-year, making the registration process quick and easy. You may also register for multiple seasons at the same time. Please click <u>Register for Athletics</u> in the drop-down menu under the <u>WHS Athletics website</u> (<u>https://woodinville.nsd.org/athletics/register-for-athletics</u>).and follow the FinalForms instructions to register

Failure to register online and have your registration approved prior to the first day of tryouts/practice makes an individual ineligible for a tryout/practice session. All coaches have been directed not to permit **ANY** student the opportunity to turnout and put the coach and school in an unnecessary liability situation.

**<u>PHYSICALS</u>**: Sports physicals are valid for two years. You may submit a physical by uploading it in FinalForms during the registration process, emailing your copy to Renae Hector at <u>rhector@nsd.org</u>, delivering the hard copy to the WHS Athletic Office or faxing it to 425-408-7402. If you prefer to send personal documents securely, use this link <u>mailfile.nsd.org/filedrop/rhector@nsd.org</u>. Sports physical forms can be downloaded from the WHS Athletics website under Register for Athletics at <u>https://woodinville.nsd.org/athletics/register-for-athletics</u>.

**<u>ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS</u>**: Student athletes in high school are expected to meet or exceed a minimum 2.0 GPA in order to be eligible to participate in school-sponsored activities. There are regular grade checks for each sports season. Visit the **<u>Eligibility</u>** website for more information at <u>https://woodinville.nsd.org/athletics/eligibility</u>.

Northshore School District Standard – Minimum 2.0 GPA each semester in addition to the WIAA (Washington Interscholastic Activities Association) standard for academics.

WIAA Standard – All athletes must be enrolled in and passing a minimum 6 of 7 classes.

For the initial grade check in the fall only, an incoming ninth grade student is not required to meet the WIAA previous semester scholarship rule provided he/she has met all other eligibility requirements. Thereafter, the student's grades will be monitored by the school every three (3) to six (6) weeks; and students will be required to meet all eligibility standards.

**RUNNING START, HOME SCHOOL or other ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION:** Students must complete either the "Running Start Students and WIAA Eligibility", "Alternative Education and WIAA Eligibility" or "Home Based Education & WIAA Eligibility" form. In addition, please include proof of enrollment, class schedule and grades. Forms are available during the FinalForms registration process and under "Students Who Don't Attend Full-Time" on the WHS Athletic website under Register for Athletics at <a href="https://woodinville.nsd.org/athletics/register-for-athletics">https://woodinville.nsd.org/athletics/register-for-athletics</a>.

**FINES:** Students must have no outstanding school fines.

ASB MEMBERSHIP: Must be purchased prior to the first competitive contest (\$60.00).

**PARTICIPATION FEE:** Must be paid prior to the first game of each sports season, after cuts are made. It is highly encouraged to make payments online through TouchBase at <a href="https://woodinville.nsd.org/resources/payments">https://woodinville.nsd.org/resources/payments</a>. If necessary, students can make in-person at the Cashier's or Main Office.

- \$154 fee for each high school sport.
- Individuals participating in more than one season will pay a maximum of \$308 per school year.

Families with two or more students participating at the same high school during the same season will be charged \$121 per participant up to a family limit of \$484 per year.

Families with two or more students <u>participating at both high school and middle school level</u> will have a family limit of \$396 per year.

**DAILY ATTENDANCE (Practice or Contest):** To participate in athletics students must attend a minimum of  $\frac{1}{2}$  the classes offered on that day.

# Injuries at School – Parent Financial Responsibility

### **Injuries at School**

The health and safety of our students is of critical importance to the Northshore School District. Even so, accidents may and do happen and the resulting medical bills can be expensive. However, many families are unaware that the district does not carry insurance for student personal injury costs and cannot assume responsibility for them.

Parent/Guardian Responsibility: What this basically means is that if your child gets hurt during school day or during a school activity, you as the parent or guardian, are financially responsible for any medical bills incurred.

This includes students participating in athletics, PE, recess and after school activities. If your student participates in a sport, please make certain your family insurance plan covers athletic participation.

# **Google Apps for Education & Optional Opt Out**

Northshore School District has the ability to create Google Apps for Education accounts for all students to gain access to the wealth of collaborative tools available through Google Apps (Google Docs, Gmail, Calendar, plus additional services).

These accounts will be used for school-related work only including communication for school-related projects, collaboration with peers, storage and access to documents, and interaction with teachers. Northshore's custom implementation of Google Apps for Education creates a secure and supervised learning environment for all students. Google Apps accounts provide students easy access to work on their documents from any location with an internet connection. Access can be through a computer or almost any mobile device or tablet. The Google Apps environment is a collaborative space for working with other students and teachers on project-based learning allowing for real-time editing and sharing. Google Apps accounts also give students access to personalized tools to help support their organization and communication (email and calendar, etc). Students without an NSD Google Apps account will have an impact to their full educational experience and may need to complete alternate assignments and may not be able to fully participate in all classroom experiences.
