EXCESSIVELY HOT OR COLD WEATHER CONDITIONS During recess periods, students may be allowed out of doors, except in case of inclement weather. If there is evidence that by being outdoors the health of students may be endangered, the principal shall require students to remain inside.

During hot weather, care must be taken to prevent heat exhaustion and or other heat syndromes; physical activities may need to be curtailed.

The campus principal shall have discretion whether to allow students outside during cold weather.

OZONE ACTION DAYS

During air pollution episodes, directives from the U.S. Weather Service will be used by campus schools to determine if conditions are such that students should remain indoors during recess times. These precautions shall be followed as they relate to physical activities by students and staff.

During “Ozone Action Days” in which the air quality is rated by the U.S. Weather Service as “Red” or “Purple” students shall remain indoors during recess periods.
