- **Big Bend Hospice**
 - The Caring Tree is designed to meet the needs of children and teens who are grieving. This program creates a safe and therapeutic environment in which young people and the adults around them can learn to understand and cope with loss. Both short and long term services are available.

This program provides coping skills, information on the right diagnosis and treatment, as well as education and support for the entire family. The group meets for six sessions, 2.5 hours per session.

F2F provides family members and caregivers with communication and problem solving techniques, coping mechanisms and the self-care skills needed to deal with their loved one's mental illness as well as its impact on the family

During the course of the 15-weekly sessions, investigators discover why poverty exists and discuss what resources a person needs in order to move out of poverty.
