ONLINE Classes: When you register for an online class, a link to the class will be emailed to you 1-2 days prior to the start date. If you do not see the link, check your SPAM, then call 651-653-3121.

Facilities Reservations: All requests for facility use within the White Bear Lake Area School District #624 should be made on either the Facility Scheduling Voicemail Line, 651-407-7503, or email your request to: facilities@isd624.org.

Refunds & Prorating: Notify Community Services & Recreation immediately if you need to withdraw from a class. Full refunds or credits are given if a class is canceled. Refunds are not issued after a class has begun. There are no prorated fees. To receive a refund, minus a processing fee, you must withdraw from an activity at least 3 business days prior to the first day of the activity.

Processing fees for classes:

- Under \$50 have a \$5 fee \$50-\$149 have a \$10 fee
- \$150-\$399 have a \$20 fee \$400+ have a \$30 fee

UCare Discount: UCare members may be eligible for a \$15 discount on most classes. If a class is less than \$15, the class will be free of charge. Members must be on UCare at the time of registration and during the class(es). Members need to include their UCare ID number when registering. This discount cannot be used for the following classes: Private lessons, alcohol-related activities, high-risk activities (skydiving, rock climbing, etc.), and gambling trips. To have your discount applied, you must call to register.

Your Privacy is Important to Us: Your registration information is considered private data under state and federal law. Information is used for the purposes of administering the activity, contacting you about upcoming activities, events or activity changes. If you choose to withhold this information, this could limit the distribution of information to the participant or instructor.

It is the responsibility of the participant or the parent of the participant to be aware that there are assumed risks in participation. ISD 624 assumes no responsibility for injuries received during activities. Building Construction Updates

Since 2019, when the community supported a bond referendum, the list of completed facilities projects has grown to include the South Campus gym addition, Transportation Facility, ALC security renovation, and elementary additions at Lincoln, Matoska, Vadnais Heights and Willow Lane.

Phase 2 is in progress and includes work at Birch Lake, Lakeaires and Otter Lake Elementaries, ALC, and the addition at the current WBLAHS - South Campus, which will be a middle school building when North Campus becomes the site of the unified high school in the fall of 2024. In Hugo, the new North Star Elementary is open for students this fall and construction will begin at Oneka Elementary. Projects in the design phase include Central Middle School and Sunrise Park Middle School site's conversion to become a multi-use facility to include District Offices, Early Childhood, Transition Education Center (TEC) and the Senior Program.

Later this fall, community members will see a capital projects levy renewal question on the November ballot. Renewing this investment, last approved by the community in 2013, puts a variety of educational tools, from classroom technology to books to musical instruments, into the hands of students. This funding also allows us to address equipment needs in the areas of safety and security, and transportation.

IV

The straight renewal of the levy is projected to generate \$2,590,309 annually for an additional 10 years beginning in 2024, with the tax rate for district property owners remaining unchanged.

The funds will be used in the following ways:

- **Safety and security:** The capital projects levy allows the district to maintain and increase safety and security measures and equipment throughout the district.
- **Technology and related services:** The capital projects levy allows the district to provide classroom technology, software and computers for students. Related services include the maintenance of equipment and technology staff.
- **Textbooks, curriculum materials and equipment, and musical instruments:** The capital projects levy allows the district to purchase textbooks, curriculum materials and equipment, and musical instruments according to our curriculum replacement cycle.
- **Transportation:** The capital projects levy allows the district to purchase buses and vans for student transportation.

I look forward to continuing the conversation about the district's capital projects levy renewal, as we hope community members learn all they can about the renewal. I will be visiting with community groups this fall, and public meetings will take place at the following times as well:
