Correctly using citations is an important part of your writing and research in seminary. Austin Seminary has approved the Chicago Manual of Style as the official style guide for student work. Please check with your professor if you have questions about the style to use for a specific assignment.

Where can you find it?

It's easy to find the Chicago Manual of Style when you need it, with links in multiple places you'll use every day, like **the top of any Sophi Search screen**, and the **Resources page on MyCampus**. When in doubt, start at the citations page:

www.austinseminary.edu/citations

Links will take you to Chapter 14 (Notes & Bibliography), which is the most relevant chapter for student work at Austin Seminary, but you can use the Table of Contents and Search features to access any part of the manual. If you are off-campus, use your seminary credentials to access the Manual.

Electronic access isn't your thing? You can also find a **print copy** of the Manual in the library (Call Number PE1478 .U69 2017)

How do you use it?

Once again, www.austinseminary.edu/citations is a great place to start. Make sure to check out the **Quick Cite Guide** for sample citations of frequently cited materials (including the Bible and the Book of Common Worship).
