





Welcome YOU back to campus!

Willy Booker '96 Head of School 2017-present I look forward to seeing you all in June, sharing memories of Burke over the years, and sharing how our history may inform the future of our school.

Attending BMA in the early 1990s, the school had a palpable sense of fluidity that contrasted sharply with "traditional" institutions that I was familiar with. There remained a sense that Burke was an experiment that had not yet fully run its course and some of the pioneers from the school's early days were still on staff, available to pass on concepts from the school's inception some 20 years before.

As we approach our 50th anniversary, I hope that the students today still sense that feeling of possibility in creating their own school and community at Burke. We may be approaching an

important milestone, but it only matters if the school's values are as dear to the Burkies today as they were to the Burkies of the '70s. I think they are.

What I do know for sure is that for the past five decades, this school has made a difference in the lives of hundreds of young men and women, both students and staff. It has proven to be a transformational experience for those lucky enough to have attended or worked here. This summer, it's appropriate that we call all the Burkies back together to mark the special occasion and to recognize the incredible impact that this school has had on our lives.



It is hard to get up here, and that's half the point. Come on up! There ain't no other place like it.

As we head toward the 50th anniversary, we can marvel at what we are all a part of. Right now I urge: It's about getting back on campus for the reunion!

Life is a contact sport, and you need to come back and touch:

The smell of the rubber in the weight room,

When I look back on our sixteen years at BMA, it is the degree of trust and pride embraced by our students and staff which are most significant. Clearly we enjoyed periods of outstanding ski results, but other top programs may be able to emulate these results and emerge for a period as the top US ski program. I know I will never again be part of a community embodying this strength of character.

Since leaving BMA, I have enjoyed interactions with many former students and staff. This pride in exceptional work ethic and commitment to a trust-based value system resulted from the

manifestation of the collective rather than individuals and commonly resonates in our conversations. Our whole carried far greater significance than individuals. We had many student/athletes who graduated with four to seven years of attendance and staff who self-proclaimed themselves as "lifers".

My fondest memories are when students or staff would walk into the office to voice what they felt was all-important to the school and witnessing the camaraderie at the base of the Poma lift during training. I'm certain this sense of shared experience unifies us and will remain an essential piece of BMA.




