New E-Team Program Elevates PG Opportunities at BMA

EASTERN CUP

This spring, BMA announced a new initiative called the BMA E-Team. The program, which replaces the traditional PG initiative, is designed to support the nation's top post-secondary school or college-aged racers who need additional time to develop their profile and the skills to qualify for National Team recognition or elite NCAA competition.

Starting with the 2019-2020 academic year, BMA's E-Team will bring together up to six female and six male athletes who constitute the U.S.'s emerging alpine racing talent to cultivate a *Top Gun* like atmosphere that will accelerate the development curve.

"Our hope is to support some of the athletes who are trying to bridge the gap between racing in high school and competing at the international level, an achievement which has never been harder than it is today." To qualify, applicants are required to meet World Rank criteria based on FIS points, pass BMA's physical test standards, and submit character references. Athletes who are accepted will pay a highly subsidized program fee of \$20,000 to have use of BMA's facilities, coaching, training, in region transportation, and room and board. For athletes who are accepted and meet the highest level of World Rank criteria, the program fee will be waived entirely.

"We hope they will be a guiding light for our school and help us raise the bar for our athletic program. The program is structured to offer mentorship opportunities so that the E-Team participants have formalized ways in which they can give back to the undergraduate community at Burke."

McGrath Joins BMA as Sport Director



Effective August 1, 2019, Felix McGrath will join BMA to take on the newly created position of Sport Director. In this capacity, he will oversee BMA's alpine development methodology for all ages including BMA's iunior program the

methodology for all ages including BMA's junior program, the academy itself, and all the way to the newly created BMA E-Team. He will work closely with BMA Athletic Director Brad Wall '97 who will continue to oversee the U14-U19 curriculum and coaches associated with the academy proper.

"It would be hard to accurately convey how significant we feel that this strategic hiring will be for our program," commented Willy Booker '96, Head of School. "Felix is one of only a small group of Americans who can claim to have been successfully developing athletes from the club level, through World Junior Championships and onto the World Cup with consistency. He not only has the pedigree as a coach and program director, but he also has competed at the highest level individually and has the added unique perspective of being one of the key contributors to the successful development pipeline in Norway."

McGrath's work at BMA will have him on site for most of the school year and all prep period camps. He will maintain his primary residence in Norway which will also allow him to act as a point person for organizing European and Scandinavian activities.

"I look forward to getting to Burke and helping this team continue to build on an already successful model," commented McGrath. "BMA is a great fit because I feel that we have alignment in our belief that long-term athletic development must be prioritized over short-term results in order to develop the skills necessary to compete at the highest level in alpine racing. Burke has all the necessary ingredients to develop great skiers: world-class training venues, excellent coaching, and the right culture. My hope is to accelerate the very positive momentum that has already been established."

McGrath is a Vermont native with a long and distinguished career in alpine ski racing as a competitor, coach, and club administrator. His career highlights include being a U.S. Ski Team and World Cup racer, being named to six World Championship or Olympic teams, having reached the World Cup podium in Slalom, and finishing third in the World Cup overall Slalom standings in 1988.


Tom Bojko College Counseling and Humanities Teacher Connecticut and coast of Maine






Spencer Newell '97 Bend, OR

To date, I have published one book. It's my memoir titled Appetite for Addiction. In the book, I describe my personal evolution to becoming an addict and alcoholic. Future books will add to this story, promoting the idea that significant life change is possible. I started writing through my blog to share my experiences until an author friend of mine suggested that I put pen to paper and chronicle my story. I love having the ability to use the medium of writing to help me better understand, in a cathartic sense, where I came from, where I am today, and where I might be able to go in the future. Also, I believe that writing in a candid and honest manner really helps people understand that it is OK to acknowledge, privately or publicly, their own personal struggles. Right now, I'm working on my second book which is the follow up to Appetite for Addiction. Apart from marketing my book, my main objective these days is to pursue my childhood dream of becoming a professional endurance athlete, currently pursuing triathlons after several years as a road cyclist and ultra-runner. In my spare time, I own my lifestyle/wellness coaching business, Novo Veritas. I'm also an athletic/running coach with Rise Fitness in Bend, OR, as well as the Development Director for a non-profit called Guardian Group, which is a leading organization in the fight against human trafficking. BMA has had a substantial impact on my journey. At BMA, it was the first time in my life that I stepped out of my comfort zone to experience life in a different sense. In many ways, my experience at Burke set the stage for my development as a person.





Nelson Rand '93 Vietnam

I have published one book: Conflict: Journeys through war and terror in Southeast Asia. This book was about my experiences covering conflict in Southeast Asia as a journalist from 1998 - 2008. Now I write private reports for foreign investors in Southeast Asia covering business and political risks for my firm Access Asia Consulting. I was first drawn to Southeast Asia because of a childhood fascination I had with the Vietnam War. I went to Vietnam right after I graduated from Burke in 1993 and realized for the first time that Vietnam was a country, not a war. I then wanted to find out more about Vietnam the country – and ended up majoring in Southeast Asian studies in university and studying in Vietnam (and Cambodia) for nearly half of my degree. The first story I covered as a journalist was some of the last fighting between Khmer Rouge guerrillas and Cambodian government forces in 1998 (the subject of the first chapter of my book). I never got into journalism because I wanted to be a journalist - I got into journalism so I could go to places and see for myself what was going on now, not read about it in history books in the future. Filming a guerrilla attack in eastern Burma, negotiating a mine-field in northern Cambodia, filming a gun battle in downtown Bangkok; these were the ultimate highs of a previous phase of my life that gave my life meaning and the content to write my book. This phase of my life ended when I woke up in the ICU of a Bangkok hospital with three bullet wounds in my hand, leg, and stomach. But now, I crave safety and luxury; my favorite place to be is a 5-star hotel and my favorite hobby is gardening. Now, I hate danger and conflict – it serves few other purposes but to possibly end your life. My time at BMA was probably the most influential time of my life. I would say it shaped my entire life, and without that experience, my life would have been completely different. It's kind of cliche to say, but to be honest the greatest lesson I learned from Burke was that there is more to life than ski racing.

Dr. Jim Taylor '76 Mill Valley, CA

I write about everything that is related to psychology. My first self-help book will be published in June. My 17th and 18th books will be published this summer. Additionally, I'm the editor of four graduate textbooks. My professional passions are psychology, sports, child development, and parenting. I always enjoyed writing (I began writing articles in Ski Racing when I was in graduate school). My purpose and passion in life is to generate and share ideas. Writing for me is a very intuitive and organic process, rather than an intellectual process. Writing is a huge priority in my career. Quite simply, it is an expression of who I am and what I value. For me, to not write is like not eating; it is just what I must do to fuel my soul. My greatest professional joy is to have hours and days in my office where I can write. My experience at Burke was seminal in my personal and professional development. I gained motivation, confidence, focus, passion, curiosity, discipline, perseverance, the list goes on. I have applied my BMA experiences to everything I've done in my personal, academic, athletic, and professional life.





Noy Holland '78 Choteau, MT

I have published five books of fiction and received grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Massachusetts Cultural Council, and the American Academy of Arts and Letters (for 2018 Katherine Anne Porter prize). Four of my books are collections of stories (I Was Trying to Describe What It Feels Like, New and Selected Stories; Swim for the Little One First, What Begins with Bird, and The Spectacle of the Body) and one is a novel, BIRD. I have taught creative writing since 1997 in the graduate program at the University of Massachusetts. I was not much of a reader as a kid because I was too physically restless. Physical restlessness and energy, I suppose, are among the reasons Burke was such a great place for me. I was an A student before I came to Burke but I was deeply disinterested in my education. Richard Enemark and Jenny Frutchy changed this for me. Frutch opened the world of dance to me and deepened my appreciation for visual art: Richard's teaching was sudden radiance in a dim room. He illuminated the beauty of literature, of language, and this gift has lasted me all these years. Burke was of course also an excellent place to learn the value of discipline, of perseverance, at least as important in writing books as it is in being a competitive athlete. Both depend on inner strength, inner reserves. I am durably grateful to these teachers and to Burke, for these lifeshaping lessons.



Bonnie St John '82 Kingston, NY

I have written seven books in total with my most recent being Micro-Resilience, *How Great Women Lead,* and *Live Your* Joy. Leadership and reaching one's potential are central themes in my books. I use my life, interviews with real people, plus research to provide inspiration and practical ways to supercharge your lives. I love giving people practical, evidence-based ways to bounce back faster! I started writing my first novel in 4th grade. Books inspired me to dream and take on big challenges despite having my leg amputated and growing up without much money. Books helped me to survive a childhood where my father left before I was born, my stepfather abused me, and I was in and out of hospitals for years. I feel fulfilled when my writing offers to others what I got from books. My husband Allen and I are currently writing a book focused on getting ahead in corporate America without losing yourself. We've worked for many years within Fortune 500 companies leading programs to encourage women to stake their claim and find the advocacy they need. BMA has been such a big part of my success journey. Burke gave me the chance to become a world-class athlete and raise the bar in disabled sports. Intense training and the camaraderie of champions pushed me to a new level. My time at BMA shaped what I teach others. It was a great opportunity that set a foundation for me to focus on a big future and make a difference for others.

Unstoppable Mikaela!

This winter, Mikaela Shiffrin '13 eclipsed more records by becoming the first athlete, male or female, to win 17 World Cup races during a season. In doing so, she broke Vreni Schneider's 30-year-old record of 14 wins. At the 2019 World Championships, Shiffrin won gold in slalom, also becoming the first Alpine skier to win the World Championship in the same discipline at four consecutive Championships. She concluded the season with the overall World Cup champion title and three discipline crystal globes, including one in Slalom and career firsts in Giant Slalom and Super-G. To date, Shiffrin has won 60 World Cup races, the 3rd most all time by a female alpine skier. She's clinched the top spot in 40 World Cup slalom races, the most all-time by a female alpine skier.

I had the opportunity to hike to the "Roof of Africa" last September with eight friends from Colorado and Germany. In Memoriam – Marty Heib, 1950-2018



After leaving BMA, I worked for the Telluride School District for 21 years as a teacher, curriculum coordinator, assessment coordinator, and gifted and talented coordinator. I was awarded the Colorado Teacher of the Year in 2008 and retired from classroom teaching in 2011. I have continued to work as an education consultant since then.

I spent the last few years writing a book titled *Joyful Learning: Saving* American Education. It includes some experiences from BMA. Of all the books about schooling, *Joyful Learning* is the first written by a teacher trying to elevate elegant and effective classroom methods to the center of the national debate.

Teaching without grades at BMA was a pivotal experience for my career. It forced me to create assignments that my students would want to master for their own satisfaction rather than for a GPA. I also had great freedom to explore and teach alternative topics, like music history. Because our class time was so limited, there was no chance of completing a traditional curriculum and I could focus, instead, on anything I fancied that contributed to critical thinking.

I keep in touch with Burkies! Several show up in Telluride to ski and some reappear after absences of 20+ years. I'm in frequent contact with Katy Kiwi, Dana Query '87, Cindy Pierce, Dan Witkowski '87, Linda Mossman '78, and Dominic Robillard '90, as well as Finn and Kathy. In just this past year I have also had a chance to break bread with Bill Knowles, Fabio Igel '88, Jesse James McTigue '91, Andi Bither Malboeuf '92, Martha Law '87, Richie Graham '87, and Kathy Duane Haskell '90.

Just after I turned 50, I met Christopher Beaver and we've been together for 10 years. Five years ago we had a civil union ceremony at the courthouse and traded this in for a marriage certificate when the Supreme Court endorsed equality.

This fall I am planning a trip to Japan. I keep elaborate travel journals for all my trips, and I'm eager to capture my discoveries there. Meanwhile, at my home desk, I'm working on paper engineering projects related to pop-up books, automata machines, and origami.
