

Board Minutes
May 17, 2022

The Johnson County Board of Education met in regular session on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 in the board office at 6:00 p.m. Chris Fields, Kevin Brantley, Alvin P. Moorman, Donald Smith, and Marty Thompson were present. Chairman Fields called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. Mr. Thompson gave the invocation and Mr. Brantley led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

The following business was transacted:

1. The agenda was approved on a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Smith; unanimous approval.
2. The April 19, 2022 regular board minutes and the April 27, 2022 called board minutes were approved on a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Smith; unanimous approval.
3. The April 2022 financial report was approved on a motion by Mr. Smith, second by Mr. Brantley; unanimous approval.
4. The Johnson County FY23 Parent Engagement policy was approved on a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Moorman; unanimous approval.
5. The following field trip was approved on a motion by Mr. Smith, second by Mr. Brantley; unanimous approval:
 - JCMHS FFA, Leadership Camp, Covington, June 13 – 17, 2022
6. Mr. Reid Bethea, JCMHS Principal, updated the board concerning his school. For Middle School he shared discipline data and reported that End of Grade Assessments results are in. Staff are evaluating these and plans are in place for any summer school for learning loss. For High School he shared discipline data and made various announcements concerning the Senior Class and Graduation. He also shared that Coach Norton plans to start a Video Production Club. Next, he honored the following students for their recent accomplishments:

 - Ansley Powell, 6th grade Young Authors Competition winner
 - Audriana Mixon, 7th grade Young Authors Competition winner

 - Rhiana Morris, 12th grade Young Authors Competition winner
7. Mrs. Tecia Mckay, Associate Superintendent, updated the board on Federal Programs including ESSER III Amendment in progress, parent engagement /parent satisfaction survey data shared with schools for impact, and the upcoming community wide field day for SES in the community. Judge Jennifer Morris and her staff is being featured. In the area of Curriculum and School Improvement,

she echoed Mr. Bethea's commendation for the students who won in the writing competitions. Finally, she reminded the board that there will be a Leadership Summit coordinated by Dr. Watkins on May 24 – 25, 2022.

8. On a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Moorman; unanimous approval was given to go into executive session to discuss or deliberate upon the appointment, employment, compensation, hiring, disciplinary action or dismissal or periodic evaluation or rating of a public officer or employee. After discussion, a motion was made to come out of executive session by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Smith, unanimous approval.
9. Superintendent Morris presented Ciera Bray for paraprofessional employment for the 2022-2023 school year. The vote was four YES with Mr. Fields abstaining.
10. The meeting was then adjourned at 6:21 p.m.
