## ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND COLLEGE PREPARATORY COURSES

Whitfield School offers eight AP courses, three accelerated courses, and one advanced college credit course. Students who take an AP course are required to take the corresponding AP exam. Whitfield School's commitment to intellectual curiosity, experiential learning, and deep critical thinking is best achieved through the rigorous courses designed by our faculty to meet students' needs. As such, **all core academic subject course work is taught at the college preparatory level or above.**

Students may not take more than three AP courses per year without petitioning the Director of the Upper School and Principal. Our school year is divided into three trimesters.

## SPECIAL FEATURES OF THE WHITFIELD EXPERIENCE



### SENIOR CAPSTONE

The culminating experience of the Whitfield curriculum, the Senior Capstone, is completed during the senior year and provides an opportunity for students to combine personal passions and interests with authentic, community-centered exploration. Students choose from a variety of options, from research and scientific thinking to community service, professional exploration, and artistic creation, among others. In addition to choosing their areas of focus, students propose a specific audience for their final exhibition, with the goal of contributing to the community.



### CAREER & MAJOR EXPLORATION PROGRAM

During Whitfield students' sophomore and junior years, they participate in programming thoughtfully designed to introduce them to a myriad of academic majors and possible career paths. Throughout three phases of exploration, students complete a variety of assessments and research potential career paths, travel to local universities to engage in dialogue with advisors and professors, and participate in conversations with Whitfield alumni to learn about daily tasks in and college preparation for particular career fields.

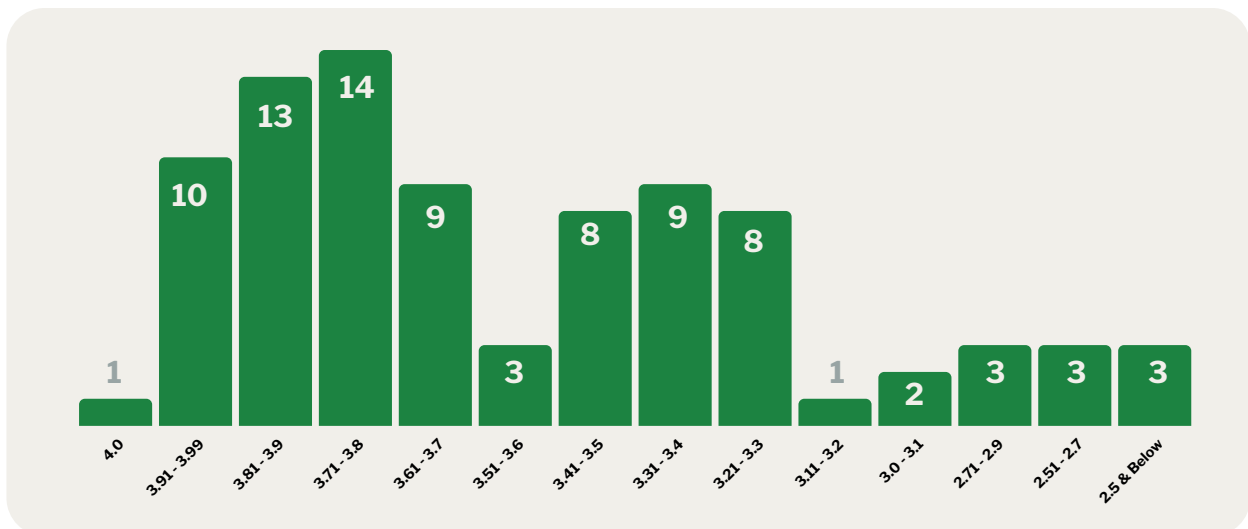


### ADVISORY PROGRAM
