WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.1(j) and (k), the Board may use competitive contracting in lieu of public bidding for procurement of specialized goods and services, the price of which exceeds the bid threshold, for concessions, and also for the operation, management or administration of other services with the approval of the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (the “Division”); and

WHEREAS, the Division has, by its Local Finance Notice (LFN 2009-10) dated June 12, 2009 (“Local Finance Notice 2009-10”), authorized the use of competitive contracting in accordance with, in relevant part, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A:4.1 through 4.5) for solar power purchase agreements, pursuant to either N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.1(j) or (k); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to use competitive contracting to procure the above mentioned specialized services; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.3(b), 4.4 and 4.5, the competitive contracting process, including the preparation of a request for proposal documentation (the “Solar RFP”), solicitation of proposals, and award of a contract based upon the methodology set forth in the aforesaid Solar RFP, must be administered by the Board’s purchasing agent; and

WHEREAS, in connection with such Solar PPA, and pursuant to Local Finance Notice 2009-10, the Board is required, to amend its Long-Range Facilities Plan, to the extent required, to incorporate the Solar Project.

NOW, THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED: by The Edison Township Board of Education in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey, pursuant to the aforesaid statutes, as follows:

1. The Board hereby authorizes a competitive contracting process for the solicitation of bids for the Solar PPA, including the distribution of a Solar RFP in connection therewith.
2. DCO Energy is hereby authorized and directed to undertake the drafting and distribution of such Solar RFP, including the evaluation of such Solar PPA bids, and to finalize a Solar PPA with a selected solar provider, to the extent awarded by the Board in conjunction with the Board’s professionals and administration.
3. DCO Energy and/or the Board’s architect of record are hereby authorized and directed, to the extent not otherwise already accomplished, to (i) submit an application to the New Jersey

Department of Education with respect to the Solar Project and to amend the School District’s Long Range Facilities Plan to include the Solar Project, to the extent it is not incorporated therein, and (ii) submit the Solar RFP to the Planning Board, as applicable, for its review.

- 4. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to appoint a committee to evaluate the Solar PPA bids and report same to the Board.
- 5. The President, Vice-President, Superintendent and Business Administrator/ Board Secretary or any other appropriate officer or representative of the Board, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents and to do and cause to be done any and all act and things necessary or proper for carrying out the transaction contemplated by this resolution, and the Solar RFP. The execution by such officials and officers of any such documents, with changes, insertions or omissions approved by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, in consultation with the Board’s professionals, shall be conclusive, and no further ratification or other action by the Board shall be required with respect thereto.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

g. Travel & Related Expense Reimbursement – 2022-2023 School Year

Executive County Superintendent approval should be requested for any transfer to an advertised administrative account [general administration (230), school administration (240), central services (251), or administrative information technology (252)] that is cumulatively more than 10 percent of the amount. The District should maintain documentation that substantiates the request was received by the Executive County Superintendent when written approval is not received.

Corrective Action

County Superintendent approval will be obtained for budget transfers individually or in aggregate that exceed 10% of the original budgeted amount.

Recommendation

The District should strengthen internal controls related to eligibility of the Title 1-A program to provide evidence of oversight and approval for eligibility.

Corrective Action

The District will strengthen internal controls related to eligibility of the Title I-A program to provide evidence of oversight and approval for eligibility.

Corrective Action

It is recommended the federal, state and local grant general ledger activity be reconciled to the underlying supporting records for each grant.

Corrective Action

Controls and procedures to be implemented to cause for the review of the recording of certain transactions to avoid the necessity for reclassifications; and that procedures and reporting be performed on schedule to reduce the risk of errors not being identified in a timely manner.

2. Student Activities

Recommendation

High School and Athletic accounts bank reconciliations should be performed and reviewed in a timely manner. The balances of high school subaccounts should be maintained accurately. Finally, the student activity club balances in the general ledger system should be reconciled to the cash balances to ensure they agree.

Corrective Action

Bank reconciliations will be performed and reviewed monthly in order to investigate any banking errors and accurately report cash balance in the general ledger and on the financial statements prior to the submission for the audit.

3. Application for State School Aid

Recommendation

1. Budget Planning and Oversight Committee

May 31, 2022 – 5:00 P.M to 6:30 P.M.

In attendance: Biral Patel, Brian Rivera, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi, Douglas Schneider, Shivi Madhukar, Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D., Ann T. Kluck, William Kolibas and Ralph Barca

Business Discussed:

- Current Capital, Finance/Facilities Projects
- Technology Purchases – Chromebook + NewLine Boards
- School Bus Subscription Rate

Recommendations:

- Committee agrees with recommendation from Administration for Students’ Device Purchases
- Committee asked Administration to review the NewLine Board items and staff device purchases and get back with additional information
- Committee decided on School Bus subscription

- Technology Purchases – Mr. Barca presented Technology Device Lifecycle - Purchase of the device and 5-year refresh rate. The District proposed to purchase the new devices for Grades 1, 6 and 8. The Committee asked about enforcement of fines and usage of the devices. They discussed options of lifecycle and wear and tear and options of children keeping the device if they maintained them in better shape. The Committee asked Dr. Bragen to find out which grades take the device home so they can identify the most optimal way to handle the devices with the inventory. Dr. Bragen recommended to put a survey out to the Community for options with device purchase at the end of school. Mr. Barca presented the option of FCC providing a grant for students not having the device at home. The FCC does their own survey. The funding was around \$688,000 for the year, based on the survey. Mr. Barca will find out the cost for repairs. The Committee agreed with the device purchases for students. Mr. Barca presented information on NewLine Boards and Devices for Administrative staff. Per the Committee’s recommendation, Mr. Barca will come back with additional information at the next meeting.
- School Bus Subscription – Currently, subscription rate is \$550 per year, whereas it costs the District over \$700 for the whole year. Further, this does not account rising fuel prices, new drivers’ additional salary, raises and other items. The Committee reviewed and decided on a new subscription bus rate.
- Current Capital, Finance/Facilities Projects – Mr. Kolibas provided information on the Edison High School Auditorium and the Upgrade of HVAC in both Cafeterias in the high school, as well as the small gym restoration. Regarding the Lincoln Elementary School project, temporary walls are being installed and roofing is ongoing.

- Committee agrees with putting majority of surplus into Capital Reserves to support the upcoming Facilities Improvement Projects
- Committee agrees with purchase of Devices for Administrative Support Staff

- NewLine Boards and Devices for Administrative Staff – Mr. Barca went over information he gathered on the NewLine Boards. Administration NewLine Boards are game changers for several. The staff should have the same technology in the classroom. All the content supervisors took the survey. The item will not impact next year’s budget. The committee agreed to go ahead with the purchase of NewLine Boards for the Middle School and High School classrooms. The Committee reviewed the updated information on devices for administrative staff and agreed with the recommendation to go ahead with devices for Administrative Staff.
- mySchoolbucks Transactions – The Committee reviewed the transactions and the financial details. The Administration found another vendor, “PaySchools” which would be ultimately beneficial financially. The Committee asked to proceed with that after performing proper compatibility check.
- ESIP Presentation – DCO Energy provided the presentation, which included items such as LED lighting upgrades, energy management system, boiler replacements, steam to hot water conversion, unit ventilator replacement, exhaust fan replacement, transformer replacement. They have just begun the process and provided the Board with tentative approval timelines for third party energy firm, Solar PPA etc. DCO Energy asked the Committee to reconvene in the beginning of August as they will have more information around that time to provide to the Committee.
- Capital Reserves – Every year in June there is a Resolution on the Agenda to put money into Capital Reserves. The Committee reviewed the information and asked to put “not to exceed \$11 million in Capital Reserves” to support the upcoming Facilities Projects to resolve overcrowding and an appropriate amount in Medical Reserves.
- Review of List of Vendors for Yearly Renewal and Vendors who are getting over \$25,000 – the Committee reviewed the list and asked the Administration to issue bids of certain vendors. MAS Masonry bid shall be issued by the Administration in August. For Allied Boiler, the bid shall be issued now. Hutchins HVAC bid will be issued now. Dr. Bragen will come back with the cost of Translation Services by Indus Translation services to the District. The Committee also discussed Roof Options and the Administration will proceed as per the current plan.

2. Glencoe Physical Science – overview: Glencoe Physical Science print student edition contains content that addresses physics and chemistry. Each chapter begins with a Launch Lab and a Theme Focus. Dinah Zike foldables occur throughout. Each chapter concludes with two pages of standardized test practice.
