

DISTRICT ACADEMIC
CALENDAR

At least every two years the Superintendent will recommend to the Board a District academic calendar that is aligned with T-2-4, the District's core values, and the strategic plan. Upon approval, the District academic calendar will be provided to students, staff, parents, and community members of the District.

The District Improvement Team (DIT) will develop academic calendar options that are aligned with the Board-approved calendar parameters. The DIT will solicit stakeholder/community input and consider that input before making a final calendar recommendation to the Superintendent. The final calendar recommendation should include:

1. First and last day of classes for the school year;
2. Semester start and end dates;
3. Student and staff holidays;
4. District-wide early release days;
5. Bad weather make-up days;
6. Staff development days (developed in partnership with the Talent and Operations and Academic Performance and Support divisions); and
7. Teacher preparation days.
