Welcome back announcements

First Day of School

The first day of the 2022-2023 school year for ALL STUDENTS will be Monday, August 29, 2022. LCTI will be open that day, and <u>all</u> LCTI students will report to homeroom at Parkland before taking transportation to LCTI or reporting to their classes.

Daily Schedule

School will start at 7:40 AM and will end at 2:44 PM. Students will be able to enter the building at 7:15 AM. Morning LCTI students will attend homeroom at Parkland High School (PHS) prior to receiving a bus transfer to LCTI.

Late Activity Bus

The school district provides one late activity bus run each school day. The activity bus will depart from the back of the D-wing at 4:30 PM Monday - Friday on the days students are in school. Only students engaged in school sponsored and supervised activities are eligible to use the activity bus. Students staying at PHS for activities beyond 4:30 PM must arrange for transportation home.

Parent Orientation

Monday, August 29

All PHS parents are invited to a presentation on Monday, August 29 beginning at 7 PM in the PHS Auditorium. The presentation will include information regarding the policies and practices at PHS. This presentation will be especially helpful to parents new to the high school.

Parents Night / Open House

PHS will hold its annual Parents Night/Open House on Thursday, September 8 beginning at 7 PM. On this evening, you will have an opportunity to hear from your son or daughter's teachers, and learn more about our programs and activities. We hope you plan to join us. From the principal's desk

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students:

I hope you are enjoying a wonderful summer with family and friends. I also hope everyone has had the chance to vacation and spend some quality time together without the stress of school. I am very excited to begin working with the PHS staff and students this fall. My transition has been a whirlwind since I was hired in July. I have met so many talented and dedicated professionals during my first months on the job. We are lucky to have fantastic people working with our students. As we begin a new school year, I would like to give you an update on all of the work we have done throughout the summer to achieve our mission of Educating the Whole Child.

Student Safety

We continue to review and practice our safety protocols in an effort to provide our students and staff with the safest possible school environment. In July, our administrative team participated in a districtwide safety drill focused on school reunification protocols. We will also hold refresher training for teachers in *Run, Hide, Fight Program* strategies to reinforce and practice procedures designed to prepare our professional staff for situations that could potentially arise. While we hope to never have to enact any of these protocols, it is critically important that our staff be prepared for emergency situations. We will continue to work with our local police and state officials to ensure we are implementing best practices with regard to all safety protocols.

Academic Achievement

In preparing for the new school year, we are eager to re-emphasize our long-standing tradition of academic excellence at Parkland High School. While we will continue to focus on student growth and achievement, we will also see the return of midterm and final exams in the 22-23 school year. (Details about these exams, including dates and schedules, will be share in the coming weeks.) In addition, we continue to offer a wide variety of courses, both required and elective, that can be scheduled for either a semester or a full year. Should your child wish to make any changes to their schedule, they must secure a Schedule Change Request Form in the Guidance Office. All course requests must be submitted to the Guidance Office during the first six days of school. Should you have any additional questions or concerns about our academic programming, please contact our Guidance Office at 610-351-5600 or connect with your child's counselor through our website.

School Culture, Climate, and Structure

Developing a positive student-centered environment is of the utmost importance to our administrative and teaching staff. With that in mind, we have begun plans for the upcoming school year that allow our students to have positive experiences during the school day and during extracurricular activities. We are proud of our tradition of excellence in academics, arts and athletics. Our sports teams won 14 East Penn

Conference Championships and 6 District XI Championships last year, and our fall sports teams are already gearing up for competition on our practice fields. Our students in the arts always excel at local, state and national competitions and perform wonderful shows on the PHS stage and we expect a wonderful year ahead.



Counseling corner

Welcome


Welcome to the 2022/2023 school year. The Parkland High School Counseling staff is available to assist you with any questions or concerns you may have regarding your son or daughter's academic program for the upcoming school year.

Student Schedules

Student schedules are currently being completed by the counseling staff and will be made available on Friday, August 26 in the early evening. If a student is considering a schedule change, request forms will be available in the Counseling Office the first day of school. Schedule change policies and procedures can be referenced in the Parkland High School Registration Information and Course Descriptions Book.

Did You Move Over the Summer?

If a student has moved over the summer to a new residence within the Parkland School District, proof of residency (2 forms) must be presented to the Counseling Office as soon as possible.





Complete Transcript Release Form

Seniors must complete a transcript release form prior to submitting college applications to the Counseling Office. Students and parents (if the student is under 18 years of age) must sign this form giving Parkland High School permission to release official academic records to colleges/universities. Students indicate on the form whether SAT or ACT scores are to be removed from the high school transcript prior to processing college applications.

Complete Recommendation Profile

If a college is requesting a counselor recommendation, the student must complete a recommendation profile form highlighting individual achievements during the past four years. Seniors need to remember to contact teachers early in the school year if they wish to request a teacher recommendation. A copy of the recommendation profile can be helpful to teachers when preparing student recommendations.

Pay Close Attention to Application Deadlines

Seniors need to remember ten school days are required to process college applications. Please pay close attention to application deadline dates. Submit your materials as early as possible to the Counseling Office. Seniors need to inform their counselor if they are processing an application online. Applications processed through online delivery systems (Common App or Coalition App) require official transcripts and secondary school information. In order to ensure timely processing of your online applications, communication with your counselor is vitally important.

SENIOR ATHLETES

Senior athletes who have not completed the NCAA Initial -Eligibility Clearinghouse form should do so as soon as possible if they are interested in participating in collegiate sports at the Division I or II levels. NCAA procedures for the college-bound student athlete are available online at <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>. Transcript requests should be made through the Parchment system.



Register for the SAT Reasoning Test

Registration procedures for the 2022/2023 SAT Reasoning Test are posted online at the College Board website, <u>www.sat.org/register</u>. The College Board requires a student photo as part of the registration process and late registration options have changed. The above changes are all part of enhanced security regulations put in place by the College Board.

Juniors and Sophomores PSAT Scheduled for Saturday, October 15

Juniors and sophomores are encouraged to take the PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test) scheduled for Saturday, October 15, 2022 at Parkland High School. The College Board allows this test to be administered only once every school year. Please mark this date on your calendar for future reference. Registration will take place in the Main Rotunda outside of the Counseling Office in early to mid-September. Students qualifying for free or reduced lunch may be eligible for a fee waiver.



Attention Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Takers:

Sign-ups will take place **September 19, 2022 through November 4, 2022.** You must sign up during this period to avoid late fees. The cost is \$97 per exam. To register, please submit a check, payable to Parkland High School, in the correct amount. On the check, please include the student's name, ID number and name(s) of the exam(s) scheduled to be ordered. If you receive free or reduced lunch, please reach out to Mr. Jeremy Gordon in the Counseling Office. Please see Mr. Gordon with any questions.



Juniors and Seniors ASVAB Testing on September 28

PSAT/SAT CollegeBoard

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Parkland High School on Wednesday, September 28. The ASVAB is an excellent opportunity for juniors and seniors to complete a career aptitude test that examines different academic, mechanical and technical areas. Students interested in a military career must take this three-hour exam. The exam is free of charge and administered by military testing personnel at the high school; however, there is no obligation to meet with military recruiters if a student completes the test. Registration for the ASVAB test will take place in the Counseling Office during the first few weeks of school.

Information from the Health Room

The 2022-23 school year is upon us. The goal of our nurses and Health Room staff is to maintain the health, safety and wellness of every student to ensure success in the classroom.

Health Condition Updates

If your child has any health condition updates, please contact the PHS Health Room to inform the staff. The contact information for the Health Room is located on the <u>Parkland High School website</u>.

Guidelines for Student Illness

The Health Room Staff would like to remind you of some guidelines to stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness during this school year. If your child, in the morning prior to school, is experiencing the following symptoms, please do not send him/her to school, even if they have a test or sporting event:

* Fever of 100 degrees or more * Vomiting *Diarrhea

* Severe head cold, persistent cough or severe sore throat It is advised that students should be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications before returning to school.

Emergency Medications

Emergency medications (epinephrine auto injectors and asthma inhalers) may be carried by the student during the school day if a physician indicates this on the Medication form. A Physician Order needs to be on file in the Health Room. Carrying emergency medications at the high school level is encouraged because of the many activities in which the students are involved.

Medication

All medication, prescription and nonprescription, must be brought to the school by a parent or guardian along with the accompanying forms from the physician at the start of the school year or as your child requires medication to be administered during school hours.

All medications, prescription and nonprescription will continue to require a doctor's order and the completion of the Medication Administration Consent and Licensed Prescriber form to be administered during school hours.

REQUIREMENT FOR JUNIORS



All students in grade 11, as mandated by the State, need to have a physical examination. This is best done by your family physician but may be done by the School Physician if you choose. A sport physical for a PIAA high school sport may be used to complete this requirement. The form for the school physical you receive in the mail is preferable paperwork for this requirement. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. Completed forms should be placed in an envelope marked "Health Room" and turned in at the Main Office. Please notify the Health Room as to how you plan on completing this requirement.



IMPORTANT DEADLINE FOR SENIORS

The required immunization deadline for all students in grade 12 to receive their 2nd dose of meningococcal vaccine (MCV) at age 16 or older is September 7, 2022. Students need to show proof of this immunization to the Health Room on or before September 7, 2022 or risk exclusion.

Latex Reminder

Several students at PHS have severe airborne Latex allergies. To protect these students, PHS is a "Latex Free" Environment.

Please do not send items containing Latex (especially balloons) to the school.

Is Your Child Turning 16 This Year? Know the Requirements for Obtaining a Learner's Permit in Pennsylvania



Students may apply for the PA Learner's Permit ON or after their 16th birthday.

- PA Learner's Permits are ONLY issues at DMV location (MacArthur Road is the nearest location).
- \Diamond The DMV is closed on Sundays and Mondays. Walk-in appointments are Tuesday through Saturday from 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM.
- Your student must have the DL-180 form completely filled out, which includes a physical examination within \Diamond six months of application. (If your child has a doctor's appointment a few months prior to turning 16, take this form with you to the appointment and save yourself a trip).
- Two official forms of identification are needed when your student applies. Most people use a birth \diamond certificate and Social Security card, but other options are listed on page 2 of the DL-180 form.
- A fee of \$35.50 is required in the form of a check or money order made payable to the PA DMV. This fee \Diamond covers a 4-year driver's license fee.
- Students will be given an objective test via computer at the DMV. Fifteen questions need to be answered \diamond correctly in order to pass, with no more than three answered incorrectly. There are a maximum of 18 random questions on any given test.
- Once your student's Learner's Permit is issued, he or she is required to complete a minimum of 65 hours of \Diamond practice supervised by a licensed driver 21 years of age or older. This practice must include:
 - 50 hours during day driving conditions
 - 10 hours at night
 - 5 hours during inclement weather

- Students are eligible to take the driver's license test after a 6-month minimum practice period. \Diamond
- \Diamond Permits have an expiration date. If needed, your student can apply for a free renewal prior to expiration.





Safe2Say Something is a school safety program that teaches students, educators, and administrators how: to recognize the signs and signals of individuals who may be at risk of hurting themselves or others; and to anonymously report this information through the Safe2Say Something App, website, or 24/7 Crisis Center Hotline.

The following provides an overview of how the program works in schools through 5 easy steps:

- 1. A tip can be submitted via mobile app, website, or by calling the PA based 24/7 Crisis Center.
- 2. The tip is then triaged by the Crisis Center to gather enough information to act on it.
- 3. The tip is delivered to the impacted school and as needed, local law enforcement via 911 County Dispatch.
- 4. The school will assess any at-risk individuals, and if needed, law enforcement will be included.
- 5. The school then closes out the tip and reports actions taken as a record for their school.

The Parkland School District Safety and Security Department webpage will host this information as well as the links to make a Safe2Say Something Student Report. Feel free to contact your building principal or myself with any questions or concerns.

Dear Parkland Parents/Guardians,

Parkland School District's top priority is to ensure that all students learn in a safe and secure school environment. The District has emergency operation plans that are updated annually and reviewed by our District's crisis management team and emergency first responders to ensure our readiness to respond to an emergency or crisis. Parkland School District will continue to work collaboratively with emergency first responders to implement the regulations enacted by the School Safety Act (House Bill 1142) of 2018. The District has implemented an in-house risk and vulnerability program through collaboration with local law enforcement that focuses on physical site security, policy enhancement, and behavioral health programming.

Act 18 of 2019 requires schools to implement threat assessment standards and practices in all public schools for the start of the 2021-22 school term. The purpose of this legislation is to create multi-disciplinary teams that will assess and resolve threats of violence towards the school community.

Annually, our staff and students will regularly practice monthly fire drills, biannual bus evacuation drills, a weather emergency drill, and biannual security-based lockdown drills.

In spring 2018, the school district's administration met with representatives from our community's police, fire, and ambulance departments to review our monthly fire drill procedures. As a team, we decided to change our fire drill response to allow the staff in each building to "evaluate" before we "evacuate" when the fire alarm sounds. Since childhood, most of us have been conditioned to immediately leave the school building when the fire alarm is heard. The unfortunate reality today is that we need to take proactive steps to ensure our school's population are not evacuating into a potentially dangerous setting. Of course, if any staff observes any signs of an active fire (fire, smoke, odor), the staff and students will immediately evacuate the building.

The goal of any protocol is to familiarize students and staff with procedures, so they will feel comfortable, safe, and secure in the event of a real emergency. We recognize that participating in such drills may heighten anxiety for some students, especially those new to the district or even new to a building. To lessen that concern, our staff will discuss the school security drills with students in an age-appropriate context.

Please talk to your child about the importance of being prepared in the event of an emergency. Our aim is to help the students feel comfortable throughout the drill. Please refer to the information at the district website under <u>Safety and Security</u> to learn more about the procedures in the event of an emergency.

Keeping our students safe and secure is a community effort. We appreciate parent support in working with the school to this end. If you have any specific questions about safety and security, please feel free to contact your child's principal.

Dear Parkland Parents/Guardians,

Parkland School District is committed to improving its programs to increase the safety and security for our school community. It will implement the mandates recommended by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency as promulgated in Act 18 of 2019.

The purpose of threat assessment is to proactively mitigate violence and resolve conflict that underlie threatening behavior. This research-based approach is considered best practice and therefore endorsed by the Department of Homeland Security and U.S. Secret Service. Threat assessment is considered a vital component to any comprehensive school district safety program.

The law requires each school entity to establish at least one threat assessment team for the assessment of and intervention with students whose behavior may indicate a threat to the safety of the student, other students, school employees, school facilities, the community, or others. The District has elected to create a threat assessment team at each building. It also establishes notification and referral requirements and procedures for when a team makes a preliminary determination that a student's behavior may indicate a threat to the safety of the student, other students, school employees, school facilities, the community or others. In order to carry out its duties, the threat assessment team must be given access to certain student data that is usually kept confidential, to the extent such access is permissible under federal law. County agencies and departments are required to consult with the threat assessment team in order to help the team carry out its duties, to the extent such agencies can do so in compliance with various state and federal laws.

Students who participate in this course will receive preparation for both the verbal and math portions of the SAT exam. The verbal classes will help students prepare for the verbal section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and test simulation in the areas of critical reading, evidence-based writing, and contextual vocabulary. The math classes will help students prepare for the math section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and simulated test taking in the areas of algebra, geometry and trigonometry including problem solving, data analysis, and practice in ratios, rates and proportional relationships.



AFTER-SCHOOL SESSION 3 - 5 PM AT PARKLAND HIGH SCHOOL OR VIRTUAL EVENING SESSION 6:30 - 8:30 PM

The course will consist of 10 two-hour sessions, five for each of the verbal and math components of the SAT exam. Students may register for one SAT prep session: either an after-school session (3 - 5 PM) at PHS or a virtual evening session (6:30 - 8:30 PM).

Important information about the course:

- ⇒ The 10-class session course will begin on Wednesday, September 21, 2022 and continue through Wednesday, November 2, 2022.
- \Rightarrow Classes will be held Mondays and Wednesdays.
- ⇒ Students will have a choice of an after-school session from 3 - 5 PM or a virtual evening session from 6:30 - 8:30 PM as seen in the schedule on the right. In the interest of scheduling, students may only select one session, after-school or evening, and may not combine after-school and evening sessions.
- ⇒ The cost for the 10-class session is \$90 to cover class materials. Checks should be made payable to Parkland School District. Please mail the check to Parkland High School, attention Mrs. McLeod or drop off your payment in the designated, wallmounted drop in the lobby near the Main Office.
- ⇒ Register for the class using the Fall 2022 SAT Prep Course Registration form on the <u>school website</u>. Course registration opens Wednesday, August 31, 2022. Registration closes on Friday, September 16, 2022 at 3PM. Registration is on a first-to-sign-up, first-to-pay basis only, so register early as space is limited.
- ⇒ The course textbook will be available for students who have completed the online registration AND whose payment has been received. The book is theirs to keep. Fully registered students will receive confirmation of their registration and information about textbook distribution via e-mail.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Once a student receives their SAT Prep Book, the \$90 fee is non-refundable.
