# STUDENT HEALTH

## **Food Allergies:**

In the interest of our youngest students with food allergies, Dell Rapids Elementary School continues to be Peanut Aware. We ask that students and parents, please, NOT bring peanuts or peanut products into DRES or send them as snacks on field trips. We would greatly appreciate your assistance in helping us keep our students with food allergies healthy and safe.

## **Latex Allergies:**

To protect our students with allergies to latex, Dell Rapids School District asks that latex balloons not be brought to school.

## **Immunization Records:**

All new students to the school district (Early Childhood, K-Prep, Kindergarten, transfer, and foreign-exchange students) must have on record in the school office an up-to-date immunization record and a copy of his/her official birth certificate by the first day of school.

## **6th Grade Immunization Requirements:**

Since the 2016-2017 school year, the South Dakota Department of Health has included in their administrative rules the requirement of both the Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis) and MCV4 (Meningococcal ACYW) vaccines for entry into the 6th grade. Vaccine requirements for Kindergarten entry have been in place for many years. This will be the fifth year of this such requirement for 6th grade entry in South Dakota. Therefore, school entry requirements for South Dakota 6th grade students include:

✓ One dose of Tdap vaccine

✓ One dose of MCV4

These requirements apply only for 6th grade entry and transfer students 6th through 12th grade. If a child is 10 years old when entering the 6th grade, they have 45 days after their 11th birthday to be vaccinated.

## **Medications:**

All students requiring medication administration during school hours must complete the proper forms. Please see or email the school nurse ([jill.dvorak@k12.sd.us](mailto:jill.dvorak@k12.sd.us)) with any questions you have.

## **TOBACCO/ALCOHOL & DRUG POLICY**

The Board of Education prohibits the use of all tobacco products in any building, vehicle, or bus owned/or operated by the school district.

## **ACCIDENT INSURANCE**

The Dell Rapids schools do not carry insurance to pay for school related accidents. If an accident occurs, costs from the accident are the responsibility of the person involved in the accident. Individuals are encouraged to carry accident insurance.

## ACTIVITY TICKET POLICY

The cost of an individual high school student activity ticket is \$20.00, and the cost of a middle or elementary student activity ticket is \$15.00. Activity tickets allow all-season admittance to most athletic events conducted by the Dell Rapids Public School and can serve as identification for student prices at other activities.

A family all-season athletic pass will be available for \$100.00. A family pass will include up to two adults (must be a parent or guardian) and all K-12 children living in one household. Other options for admittance to school activities include the adult 10-punch athletic pass for \$30.00 or adult all-season athletic passes for \$50.00 each. Regular contest athletic competition admission prices are \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for students, and \$6.00 and \$4.00 for double-header games, respectively.

Activity passes are non-refundable.

## SENIOR CITIZEN ACTIVITY PASSES

Senior citizens (age 62 & over) who are residents of the Dell Rapids School District can receive free admission to most Dell Rapids Public School athletic events. A card will be required to receive free admission. Contact the District Office at 428-5473, option 1, for information on how to get this free lifetime pass.

## ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Emergency Response Act (AHERA) in the summer of 1998, we performed inspections of our school buildings for asbestos containing building materials (ACBM) The inspection findings and asbestos management plan have been on file in the school administration office since that time.

The EPA requires us to perform re-inspections of the ACBM every three years and six month surveillances each year for any change in condition of the ACBM. An accredited management planner reviewed the results of the re-inspections and recommended actions we should take to safely manage the ACBM in our buildings.

The ACBM in this school is in good condition and we will continue to manage them in place as recommended by the accredited management planner. We plan on taking whatever steps are necessary to ensure your children and our employees have a healthy and safe environment to learn and work in.

The results of the most recent inspect performed July of 2021 are on file in the school administration office. Everyone is welcome to view these anytime during normal school hours (Monday through Friday 8:00am-4:30pm). # PARTICIPATE IN THE 2021 FCCLA NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

The 2021 Hybrid Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America National Leadership Conference was held on June 27 to July 1. Faithe Larson qualified to participate at the national level in her Fashion Construction STAR Event at state meeting held in April. She received a silver rating on her event. The competitive STAR Events were submitted and evaluated virtually. Beverly Rieck served as a room consultant for one of the virtual events. She and Rylee Rinehart, who is serving as the 2021-22 State FCCLA President, with the other six members of the Executive Council attended the in-person meeting held in Nashville. They presided over the two South Dakota state meetings. The opening general session speaker was Sabrina Thompson Mitchell and award winners were announced in the other general sessions. Participants were able to choose workshops and trainings on topics related to national projects and activities and career pathways. Other workshop topics included community service, ethics, self-care practices, interviewing skills, and resume tips all related to family, work, and societal issues. Leadership trainings were held for the state officers. One session was a hands-on activity where one could make their own Goo Goo Cluster candy bar that was invented in downtown Nashville. South Dakota attendees also toured the Hermitage and attended the Grand Ole Opry one evening.

## Ag In Action

This summer has been a little closer to normal, if we even know what that is anymore. Many of the usual camps, farm shows and conferences have been held and we are hopeful that the school year will start and continue without any modifications necessary. We did learn last year that even with modifications, we can persevere and overcome obstacles.

Agriculture classes offered for the fall semester include two sections of Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources. One section will be during 2nd block and the other will be during 4th block. Those students will explore the role of the FFA organization in Agriculture Education, define and discuss the concepts of natural resources, demonstrate an understanding of animal science systems, demonstrate an understanding of plant structure and function, relate basic food science technology principles to production agriculture, summarize basic food science technology, and summarize basic principles involved in agricultural systems technology. Those students will also have the opportunity to learn about shop tools and shop safety, project design and construct a small wood project. This class will last the entire semester and will be worth one credit toward graduation.

The class offered during the first half of 3rd block will be Wildlife and Fisheries. The students enrolled in this class will have the opportunity learn about the importance of fish and wildlife management, comparing life patterns of fish and wildlife, identifying economic and social issues related to fish and wildlife as well as careers in wildlife and fisheries. This class will last the entire semester and will be worth a ½ credit toward graduation.

Fundamental Animal Science will be offered during the second half of 3rd block. The students in this class will apply knowledge of anatomy and physiology to produce and/or manage animals in a domesticated or natural environment; recognize animal behavior to facilitate working with animals safely; provide proper nutrition to maintain animal performance; know the factors that influence an animal's reproductive cycle; identify environmental factors that affect an animal's performance. This class is also a half block class which will last the entire semester earning students a ½ credit toward graduation as well.

The sixteen acres of school land is utilized by the agriculture classes as a land lab and allows the FFA members to apply crop production skills. Kevin Schnieders worked the land to prepare the seed bed for the planting of corn. He also volunteered his time and equipment to plant corn on May 15. The corn seed was donated by Ed's Produce, Dell Rapids CO-OP Grain Co., Sioux River Ag and Channel Seed. The corn will be monitored during the rest of the growing season by the FFA members and will allow students this fall to see and learn about crop production, fertility, pest management and grain marketing. The corn will be harvested this fall and the money brought in from the sale of the crop will go into the FFA account to fund all of the FFA activities throughout the year.

The start of summer break found several FFA members serving

lunch to students who were enrolled in driver's education during their four days of classroom instruction on May 25-28. Those members helping serve were Katie Scherff, Faithe Larson and Karlie TenEyck. The state FFA leadership retreat held at Swan Lake near Viborg was attended by Karlie TenEyck on June 22-25. Karlie and the other 47 participants developed and enhanced their leadership skills and self-confidence through interactive learning. The program featured workshops that helped members discover the value of servant leadership, personal values, personal and team strengths, creating effective teams, Ag advocacy, positive mindset, and conflict resolution. The members will use these new skills and ideas to benefit their local chapters and communities. The Dells FFA chapter officers decided to have an entry in the Quarry Day parade along with working with Dells Vet Service to have an animal nursery in the city park following the parade. The chapter officers got together at Thunder Road in Sioux Falls on July 15th to plan activities and set goals for the 2021-22 school year. It was decided during that time to also have an entry in the Moody County Fair parade in Flandreau on July 29.

Any student enrolled in a high school agriculture education class during the fall semester or the spring semester is eligible to join the FFA organization and participate in the various activities and events throughout the year. ## MY CHILD'S TEACHER

What do I know about my child's teacher? The federal education law called the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) requires that all parents in a Title I school be notified and given the opportunity to request information about the professional qualifications of classroom teachers instructing their child. If you are interested in this information, you may send your request to the building principal who will provide a response.

## SCHOOL MEALS

The Dell Rapids School District provides nutritious meals in accordance with dietary guidelines for Americans as established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Health. This year (2021-2022), free meals will be provided to all students, thanks to a waiver granted by USDA.

Lunchtime Solutions serves complete, well-balanced meals that are attractive and satisfying to students, providing nourishment that allows students to excel in the classroom and lead happy, healthy lives. All students are encouraged to enjoy the nutritious breakfasts and lunches.

A limited number of a la carte items will be available for sale in the middle school and high school. Except for beverages, lunch snack items will only be sold to students who purchase a full meal. All selections will be deducted from the student's meal account, unless paid for with cash at point-of-sale, so parents/guardians should visit with their child(ren) about extra items they may or may not purchase. Parents/guardians are encouraged to use the MySchoolBucks website to monitor their child(ren)'s purchases.

The district uses NutriKids computer software for record keeping. Each student has his/her own lunch account, and the district requests advance payment. Any dollar amount can be deposited toward future purchases. It is strongly recommended that deposits into students' accounts be made online. Payments can also be given to building secretaries. Checks should be made out to Dell Rapids School, and the child's name should be written on the check.

On the MySchoolBucks.com website, parents are able to view their child's account balance, access their child's eating history report for the past thirty days, and sign up for low balance notifications. The MySchoolBucks.com website is also a convenient, easy and secure online prepayment service to deposit money into a child's school meal account. There is no fee for making meal deposits online. More information on how to access this service is available on the district website at [dr-k12.org](http://dr-k12.org).
