<p>Assessment Policy Retesting Procedures</p>	<p>Frequently during the year, formative assessments will be given. These will be in the form of homework, written or oral quiz, readings and discussion, student writing, or tests. Feedback will be given on all formative assessments.</p> <p>The formative assessments are critical to learning because they provide feedback as to what essential learning we will focus on next. They will help influence and shape the process of learning while we still have time to improve before test or grades are given.</p> <p>Students may retake tests only upon receiving a failing grade of below a 70%. The time and date for all retests is determined by the teacher.</p> <p>Semester Exams will not be eligible for retest.</p>
<p>Late Work Policy</p>	<p>All work is due at the designated assigned time.</p> <p>Late work due to absences: Students absent on a day work is due shall receive a due date for the next class meeting. All homework is due at the beginning of the class hour. Assignments submitted electronically are due before the beginning of class time on the scheduled due date. Students who are absent on the day work is assigned will be assigned said work upon their return to class and given the same time frame for completion as originally assigned.
