KEY TAKEAWAYS

Our board meeting agendas often include many items for discussion. While you will always be able to review the agenda, meeting minutes and video recordings of these meetings on [our Board webpage](#), this Board Bulletin provides key takeaways for our Stevenson community.

- 1** On Monday night, Don Tyer was sworn in as a newly appointed board member by Superintendent Dr. Eric Twadell. His appointment is effective immediately and expires May 1, 2023.
- 2** At a separate Site and Facilities committee meeting, select board members reviewed a list of potential construction projects that could be slated for summer 2023. These ongoing maintenance project include rebuilding of tennis courts, creation of new parking where a construction trailer currently resides, upgrades to the security office, carpet replacement, upgrades to a Project Lead the Way classroom, and the beginning of several significant upgrades to the Performing Arts Center.

The board approved for Wight & Co. to create construction drawings. Once the drawings are complete, Gilbane will conduct a bid for these projects, the results and costs of which will be presented to the Board in December. **Please note these construction projects are pending.** The Board will fully authorize any summer 2023 projects at the Dec. 19 board meeting.
- 3** The board also approved an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Lincolnshire and Vernon Township to create a school speed zone on Port Clinton Road. The section of Port Clinton will have a reduced speed limit, live speed monitor and striped roadway. Stevenson's cost for the project is estimated to be less than \$25,000.
