RE: Results of 2016 Illinois Youth Survey

#### **BACKGROUND**

This report was provided as an information item to the Committee of the Whole Board at its September 13 meeting. Since 2006, on an every-other-year basis, OPRFHS has administered the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) to sophomores and seniors. The survey asks questions about a number of topics related to student health and safety. Of primary local interest have been students' responses related to alcohol and other drug use. This report provides a summary and visual displays of several key aspects of students' perceptions and self-reported substance use. The full data set from IYS is also attached for your review.

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

2016 marked the sixth time OPRFHS has administered the IYS. Survey results in 2016 include 676 sophomores and 453 seniors. A number of patterns emerge in the comparisons of 2016 data to 2014 and in the longitudinal comparison from 2006-2016:

- Self-reported use in 2016 was lower across most of the named survey substances, both in comparison to 2014 and when compared to several prior survey years. (Fig. 1, 2, 3)
- Declines are larger for sophomores than for seniors for most substances except cigarettes, where there was a larger percent decline among seniors. (Fig. 1, 2, 3)
- While in both the short-term and the long-term reported marijuana use was lower among sophomores, reported use among seniors was higher. (Fig. 1, 2, 3)





Figure 4. Percent of Students Admitting to Being Drunk or High at School One or More Times, Past Year

- The percent of students reporting they were drunk or high at school in the past year is lower compared to 2014 and over the span from 2006-2016 (Fig. 4).
- Compared to their Illinois peers' 2014 data:
  - Smaller percentages of OPRFHS sophomores reported using cigarettes, alcohol, and inhalants (IYS 45, 47); driving under the influence of alcohol or marijuana (IYS 57); and binge drinking (IYS 47). A slightly higher percent reported marijuana use (IYS 45, 47).
  - Larger percentages of OPRFHS seniors reported using alcohol and marijuana (IYS 46, 48); binge drinking (IYS 48); and driving under the influence of marijuana (IYS 58). Lower percentages of OPRFHS seniors reported using cigarettes (IYS 46).
  - A higher percentage of OPRFHS seniors had a response pattern indicating they may benefit from an individual substance abuse assessment (IYS 60).
  - For both sophomores and seniors, OPRFHS smaller percentages of students reported bullying victimization across most categories (IYS 61-66) and dating violence (IYS 67).
  - Despite higher percentages of seniors reporting use, OPRFHS students report later "first use" ages for all substances, and lower percentages say they used a substance before age 15 (IYS 49, 50).
  - OPRFHS sophomore and senior responses were more positive for school climate measures (IYS 68, 69).

Taken as a whole, the data provide a mixed picture of our students' experiences with substances. The downward trend for many substances is obviously good news, as are the declining rates of binge drinking and students being drunk or high at school. At the same time, rates of use among seniors continue to surpass state averages.

To promote our students' healthy decision-making and well-being, the 2016-2017 school year will feature multiple

school-wide substance abuse prevention and wellness programs and initiatives, as well as prevention and wellness programs for groups and individual students. All programs listed below are overseen by Ginger Colamussi, our Student Assistance Program (SAP) Coordinator. The SAP Coordinator is a member of Student Services and the school social work team whose focus includes substance abuse prevention, wellness, and healthy decision-making.

#### **School Wide Programs**

- Project Towards No Drug Abuse
  - o 5 PE/Health teachers trained and 2 PE/Health teachers will pilot program
  - 12 classroom-based lessons on motivation, skills, and decision making
- Marijuana Prevention Communication Campaign
  - Objective: Increase the number of OPRFHS students who perceive marijuana use to be risky
  - Media materials posted every 3 weeks: Posters & bathroom stall newsletters
- Healthy Youth Peer Educators (HYPE)
  - o 23 students accepted and trained
  - o Student-led classroom workshops, lunchtime activities, and special events
- Operation Snowball
  - o 20 student leaders, 20 faculty & staff volunteers, and 180 student participants
  - o Annual leadership development and youth empowerment retreat weekend

#### **Group Programs**

- Take Charge
  - o 10 sessions for 9th & 10th graders with attendance, academic, or behavioral challenges at risk of substance abuse
  - o Focuses on personal self-management skills, general social skills, and drug resistance skills
- Beyond the Binary & True Colors
  - Ongoing support groups for LGBTQ+ students at risk of substance abuse
  - o Focuses on gender and sexuality exploration, support systems, and coping skills

#### **Individual Programs**

- Steps Forward
  - 3 sessions for students interested in reducing or stopping their substance use (For student referrals or suspension re-entry)
  - Focuses on risks of substance use, triggers and cravings, goal-setting, and drug resistance skills
- Referrals & Recovery Support
  - o Referrals for community-based substance abuse treatment program
  - Recovery support following community-based substance abuse treatment programs

Ms. Colamussi provided additional information during the meeting, highlighting some of the more salient contributing factors, including students' low perceived risk of harm from using alcohol and marijuana and low perceived parental disapproval and monitoring among students.

Questions and discussion included inquiries about heroin and prescription drug use rates, the potential impact on student perceptions and use of marijuana with the new medical marijuana dispensary in Oak Park, and the increase in reported use from sophomore to senior year. There was also discussion about whether the data could be disaggregated by race and gender, whether it was possible to know more about student mental health concerns, given the percentages of students who indicated they had been depressed or experienced suicidal thoughts in the past year, and whether the high school is tracking the impact of our prevention and wellness programs. It is possible some of the additional questions we asked, for which we recently received results, will shed light on common student stressors, and plans are in place to evaluate the evidence-based interventions we are using this year.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

This report is provided as an information item to the Board of Education. No action is required at this time.

Figures 2-3. Changes in Self-Reported Use Rates

**Tables can be helpful when** you are looking for a summary of responses for particular survey questions, for example, the percentage of 8th grade youth who report using prescription pain killers to get high. Some tables may contain a mean score (an average of all the responses), a median score (the middle point of all responses given) or an "N" (number of students who responded to that question). Tables can also be useful when you need specific data to support a grant or report. If you see an "N/A" (Not Applicable) noted in a table, this indicates that the question was **not asked at that grade level**. If you see an "N/R" (Not Reported) noted in a table, this indicates that *at least 90% of students skipped the question for no known reason*, making the results too biased to report.

**Summary charts can be helpful** to view multiple questions in one place (e.g., use of different drugs to determine which is the most used) and to compare your results with the scientific sample of Illinois students who participated in the 2014 IYS. State level results from the 2016 IYS will not be available until late fall. IYS state level norms from 2014 are a good benchmark for immediate decision-making because state estimates stay relatively stable across two IYS administration years. 



# Substance Use in the Past Year Among 10th Grade Youth











# Average Age of First Use Among 12th Graders Having Ever Used the Drug\*





## First Use Before Age 15 Among 12th Graders Having Ever Used the Drug\*





# New Users in the Past 12 Months\* Among 10th Grade Youth














## Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth


## Extent of Bullying in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth


## Extent of Bullying in the Past 12 Months Among 12th Grade Youth



# Bias-Based Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth







## Dating Violence\* in the Past 12 Months By Grade




## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 10th Grade Youth




## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 12th Grade Youth



## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores By Grade in 2016




## Mental Health Concerns in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth







# Prevalence of Obesity\* According to BMI By Grade






