Park Tudor School, located in northeast Indianapolis, is an independent, coeducational, college-preparatory day school for students in prekindergarten through grade 12.

The School was established in 1970 by a merger of Tudor Hall School for girls (1902) and Park School for boys (1914).

Park Tudor offers a rigorous academic program complemented by a co-curricular program of organizations and clubs, fine arts, and athletics.

The school offers more than \$4.4 million annually in financial aid. Enrollment for the 2022-23 school year is: JK-Grade 5: 342; Grades 6-8: 210; Grades 9-12: 413. Thirty-eight percent of the student body is racially and ethnically diverse.

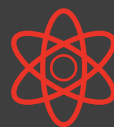

MARKING SYSTEM & GRADE DISTRIBUTION

A cumulative unweighted grade point average is provided on each student's transcript. The GPA reflects equal weighting for all courses that earn one credit except P.E. and Health. A weighted GPA, reflecting an additional one point for AP courses and one-half point for other advanced courses (e.g. Pre-Calculus) is also provided.

The unweighted GPA range for the last several years has extended from a high of 4.0 to a low of 2.23, with a median GPA of 3.51.

While there are no courses designated as "Honors" on the transcript, **all academic courses are taught at the Honors level.** 19 AP courses are offered.

Park Tudor is a member of the Cum Laude Society, a national organization for secondary schools that recognizes scholastic achievement and encourages the qualities of excellence, justice and honor modeled after the college scholastic fraternity Phi Beta Kappa. Up to 20% of the senior class, based on an unweighted cumulative GPA through the end of the fall semester of their senior year, may be inducted into the Cum Laude Society.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

In 2022, 229 students in Grades 9-12 took a total of 596 exams in the subjects listed below.

Enrollment in AP courses is largely by self-selection, although certain prerequisites may prevail.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Park Tudor students who have completed the requirements in a department, have conducted extensive outside academic research, or who have transferred from another school with curriculum requirements that do not align, may undertake an independent study project with permission from the department.

COVID STATEMENT

For the 2021-2022 academic year, Park Tudor continued to offer in-person instruction five days a week with limited disruption. A distance learning option was only available to students directed to quarantine. In the 2020-2021 academic year, the school operated under in-person instruction with the exception of county-mandated online instruction beginning on November 11. During this time, students received online, synchronous classroom instruction via a web portal. In-person classroom instruction resumed on January 11, with the option for students to attend in-person classes or to continue live distance learning. For those students learning from home, active participation during instruction was required. Throughout the pandemic, grading for all students continued to be held to traditional, letter grade standards.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a minimum of 40 credits during their high school years in order to qualify for a diploma. At least 32 of those credits must be earned in the six departments of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Languages, and Fine Arts.

Required distribution of credits is as follows:

Within the five academic departments students must take (at a minimum) the following courses:

- **English:** Four full years (I, II, III, and IV)
- **Mathematics:** Three full years
- **Science:** Biology, either Chemistry or Physics, and one other science
- **Social Studies:** World Civilizations I, II, and U.S. History
- **World Languages:** Two years of one language in grades 9-12
(Three or more strongly encouraged)

Students must enroll in five full-credit subjects (four academic) or the equivalent each semester. If a course is failed and later retaken and passed, both grades appear on the official transcript and both grades are included in the GPA calculation. Courses taken and passed may be retaken but cannot be counted for credit (towards graduation or athletic eligibility) twice. Normally this is done to improve performance; both grades appear on the transcript but the second grade is not factored into the GPA. Community service is strongly encouraged, but not required.

COLLEGE MATRICULATION

Park Tudor’s mission is to create an inspiring learning environment that prepares and motivates students, fostering persistence, imagination, problem-solving and intellectual agility. To this end, we help our students discover their passions and find colleges that align with their talents, personalities, and goals. We take pride in the wide range of colleges on our matriculation list, representing the great diversity of talent and interests of our students.
