DUAL CREDIT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: Students enrolled in dual credit eligible courses at Park Hill High School must meet both the initial eligibility requirements and course specific requirements to enroll in the course for college credit. **Dual Credit courses are \$60.50 per credit hour.**

[^] If you have an AP Score of 3 or higher on AP English Language & Composition, you will receive credit for ENGL 101 and do not need to complete placement testing for Composition & Reading.

* If taking the Accuplacer for Composition & Reading, both the reading and writing tests are required. The scores are dependent upon each other.

⁺The Math Accuplacer is a two-part test. Students must score high enough on the first test, Quantitative Reasoning & Statistics, in order to take the second test, Advanced Algebra & Functions. The student's score on the second test is used to determine dual credit eligibility.

Students must apply to MCC to enroll in the college portion of dual credit or to take the ACCUPLACER. Apply at mccck.edu/apply.

Wednesday, September 21 st	<p>Step 5: Check your MyMCCKC to ensure you are enrolled in the correct courses. Contact Dr. Miller if your enrollment is incorrect.</p>
Friday, October 14 th	<p>Step 6: Pay in FULL for your dual credit class(es) OR sign up for a Payment Plan OR be dropped. (Dual Credit bills will be mailed to the student's home address. All payments are made to Maple Woods.)</p>
