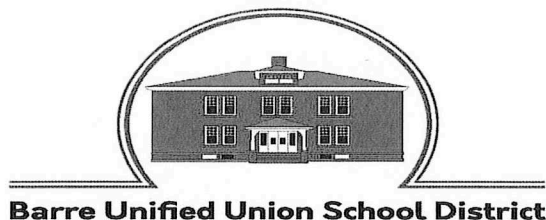

**SEA School Board Report**  
**8-22-2022**

This summer marked the first Summer Program for students attending the SEA and it was a resounding success. Twenty-one of our students attended at some point in the summer with most days averaging between 10 to 15. Students and staff engaged in working on projects such as building cornhole boards and tending the garden as well as experiencing active healthy activities in the community. These included mountain biking, paddling, and a trip to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science. It was especially exciting to see so many of our incoming 9th grade students joining us for the first time. Those students now know the building and have made connections with staff and peers before starting the school year next week.

As the school year is about to start Staff are preparing for the return of students. There are many training sessions for new and returning staff and a focus on strengthening our systems of support for students at the SEA. Although we still have a few positions to fill, the staff we have hired are already contributing and adding to the culture of caring in our programming. We continue to interview for the positions of Student Support Specialist and Special education teacher. We are looking forward to the arrival of students and a successful new school year.
