

## **Board Minutes June 21, 2022**

The Johnson County Board of Education met in regular session on Tuesday, June 21, 2022 in the board office at 6:00 p.m. Chris Fields, Kevin Brantley, Alvin P. Moorman, Donald Smith, and Marty Thompson were present. Chairman Fields called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. Mr. Thompson gave the invocation and Mr. Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

The following business was transacted:

1. The agenda was approved on a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Smith; unanimous approval.
2. The May 10, 2022 called, May 17, 2022 called, May 17, 2022 regular, and May 24, 2022 called board minutes were approved on a motion by Mr. Thompson, second by Mr. Smith; unanimous approval.
3. The May 2022 financial report was approved on a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Thompson; unanimous approval.
4. On a motion by Mr. Brantley, second by Mr. Smith, approval was given to adopt the final FY23 budget with Mr. Brantley, Mr. Smith and Mr. Fields voting yes and Mr. Moorman and Mr. Thompson voting no. The motion passed 3-2.
5. Superintendent Morris presented a resolution for SPLOST 5. This resolution was approved on a motion by Mr. Thompson, second by Mr. Brantley; unanimous approval. A copy of this resolution is attached and becomes a part of these minutes.
6. The following fund-raising requests were approved on a motion by Mr. Smith, second by Mr. Thompson; unanimous approval:

7. Mr. John Buxton, JCMHS Assistant Principal, updated the board concerning his school. For Middle School he shared that summer school finished up last week and was a success. STEM camp was also successful as students participated in: Robots Rule, Lit Theater, Grow & Glow (SEL), Trojan Enrichment, and Pickle Ball. The Cheerleaders are practicing and MS Football will begin after the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. For High School he shared that summer school was also successful with students recovering credits and 4 Seniors finished and will be Summer Graduates. STEAMS camp began today with 34 students attending. (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math, and SEL) Cheerleading and Football practices are going strong. He also gave a special thanks to the custodial staff for their hard work on the floors to have the building ready for the new school year.
8. On a motion by Mr. Smith, second by Mr. Brantley; unanimous approval was given to go into executive session to discuss or deliberate upon the appointment,

employment, compensation, hiring, disciplinary action or dismissal or periodic evaluation or rating of a public officer or employee. After discussion, a motion was made to come out of executive session by Mr. Moorman, second by Mr. Brantley; unanimous approval.
