Subject: Class Description:	Students read and discuss a variety of genres of literature, including fiction (short stories and excerpts from novels), nonfiction (essays and articles), poetry, and drama. Units of instruction include the following: • elements of fiction (plot, character, setting, theme, and point of view); • elements and types of poetry; • figures of speech, including imagery, similes and metaphors, onomatopoeia, hyperbole, alliteration, personification, etc.; and • intended audience and purpose of various authors.
	Students also learn and practice basics of good writing skills, including organization of ideas, fluency, word choice, conventions, and use of specific and concrete detail.
	This class meets graduation requirements for the State of Washington and Kennewick School District, as well as meeting a range of state standards This is a year-long course for 2022-2023 school year for which students have the potential to earn a .5 credit for each of two semesters
