P.S. I have included some important information below for school opening, including the general procedures that we will follow.

### First Day of School & Reopening Procedures:

- All student schedules will be mailed Thursday, August 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Main Doors open at 8:30am for students Students that arrive early will have to wait outside of
  the school building until opening time indicated. All students must enter the building with a
  mask. Students that are not eating breakfast will report directly to the auditorium for our daily
  morning meeting. Students that are eating breakfast will report to the cafeteria.
- At the conclusion of our daily morning meeting, students will transition to their assigned Family. Family assignments will be posted on every hallway throughout the school building.
- Students will receive an updated schedule during Family to ensure accuracy.
- New COVID-19 guidance is listed below. Please read over this information carefully. It has been updated and a lot has changed.
- All students will eat lunch together this year. Lunch will take place after 2<sup>nd</sup> period classes. Lunch times will vary based on the bell schedule of the day. We have a total of three bell schedules (Regular, Activity, and Family/Club).
- Students will receive important forms along with a hard copy of their schedule. All forms should be completed and returned to their Family head by the end of the first week of school.
- Please note that Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> a student holiday.
- Students that request a schedule change will be directed to complete a schedule change request form. These forms will be located in the main office.
- All students must use the sign in/out system when leaving their classroom after receiving permission from their teacher. This is standard practice for our school culture.
- We will implement our 10/10 rule which indicates no movement in the building during the first ten minutes and last ten minutes of class, unless it's an emergency.
- All students will participate in safety drills the first week of school. These drills include fire, tornado, evacuation, lockdown, bus, etc.

#### **COVID-19 Guidance for 2022-2023:**

The information below will be revisited every 2 months by the district, and you will receive updates.

#### RPS will continue:

- 1. Promoting vaccination and staying "up to date"
- 2. Consistent and correct use of masks inside (given High community level)
- 3. Testing
- 4. Ensuring HVAC/air quality
- 5. Handwashing/hand sanitizing
- 6. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities
- 7. Daily symptom checking and staying home when sick and getting tested

### Key changes from last year are:

• Masks are not required outdoors on RPS property for staff or students; however, masks *are* required indoors for staff and for students (unless an opt out).

- Quarantine is no longer required after exposure for asymptomatic individuals; mask use, testing, and symptom monitoring are recommended (but not required).
- COVID-19 tests are available to all students and staff, as requested.
- The isolation period for positive individuals is 5 days (mask wearing and distancing during lunch required on days 6-10).
- Co-isolation is no longer required for ongoing exposures (household exposures); individuals should monitor symptoms.
- Communication frequency/protocols have been modified (daily updates will not be sent; cases will be tracked on the districts website).

#### Arrival/Dismissal:

Below is a very important message from our Safety & Security Department after evaluating our dismissal and traffic process. Please adhere to these guidelines. Parent pickup and drop-off is at the front of the building on E. Brookland Park Blvd. Students and parents should be using the crosswalks at each corner to safely cross the street. Mid-block crossing is dangerous, and visibility is limited. Drivers should follow traffic laws at all times. To avoid traffic collisions, no U-turns should be done in the middle of the street. We want all students and their families to arrive and depart safely at all times.

Please avoid using Woodrow Ave if possible, as this street is used for bus arrival and dismissal. If you have to use Woodrow Ave. when buses are loading and unloading, **vehicles are to remain stopped while the stop sign is out and flashing red.** (<a href="https://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/46.2-859">https://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/46.2-859</a>) There is a fine of \$250 for violations of passing a stopped school bus.
