As a Washington Park Elementary teacher, I will...

- At the beginning of year, schedule Parent Teacher Conferences for parents/student to discuss students' current reading and math levels, set goals and provide strategies for improving both levels.
- Provide parents with monthly newsletters including strategies and activities to use at home to target the students' needs. Websites will be provided for building reading, vocabulary, and mathematics skills.
- Hold Lexile goal-setting conferences with students in grades 3 – 5, and share the goal-setting worksheet with students and parents 2 times per year.
- Hold individual meetings, discuss math/reading data results, and develop a plan of action for student success.
- If applicable, support student learning and communicate with families regularly regarding JCVA student progress.

As a Washington Park Elementary family member, I will...

- Attend scheduled meetings and Family Engagement Events with my child to learn strategies to assist my child in improving literacy, reading, and math skills.
- Use interactive resources provided by the school and/or teacher to assist my child with building fluency and problem-solving strategies.
- Utilize information provided by my child's teacher to help increase my child's reading level as well as comprehension strategies at home.
- Review the Lexile goal with my child and set aside a minimum of 20 minutes a day at home for daily reading of texts at the appropriate Lexile Measure.
- Review the math goal with my child and set aside a minimum of 10 minutes at home for daily math facts/skills practice.
- If applicable, establish a home learning coach to facilitate the learning of JCVA students and communicate with school-based teachers regarding student progress.

- ✓ Attend conferences, meetings, and Family Engagement events with my family and use strategies/skills learned.
