

Late Afternoon Checkouts and Messages

Parents, we need your help: please don't call the school after 2:00pm and leave instructions for us to deliver a message to your child about where they should go after school (Regular carpool, go to FAST after-school, ride home with someone the child doesn't usually ride with, etc.). We realize that folks sometimes have emergencies or unexpected changes in plans, but keep in mind that the last hour of the day prior to student dismissal (Elem 1:45-2:45pm; Middle 2:15-3:15pm, High 2:40-3:40pm) is the most hectic time of day in the FLA offices.



Whenever possible, please call us before lunch, or right after lunch if necessary, but not the last hour of the school day. We simply cannot handle the volume of message and walk-in traffic that typically hits us during that last hour.

On a related note, when checking your student out early please check them out at least 30 minutes before dismissal (Elem 2:15pm, Middle 2:45pm, High 3:10pm). Checking students out five or fifteen minutes early in order to avoid waiting in the carpool line is not an option.

Falls Lake Academy COVID Education Plan 2021-2022 Updated 8/30/21

Falls Lake Academy is operating at full capacity with face to face instruction for the 2021-2022 school year. We are committed to maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment with the goal of keeping students in school to meet the educational, social, and emotional needs of our students. We have put COVID protocol in place to mitigate the spread of infection. It is critical that families partner with us and follow all COVID protocol to ensure our school can operate safely.

Information about COVID-19:

Symptoms to be aware of that may suggest referral for Covid-19 testing or evaluation:

Fever (100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher)
Sore Throat
Chills
Cough
Congestion or runny nose
Difficulty Breathing or shortness of breath
Headache
Muscle or body aches
New loss of taste/smell
Nausea or vomiting
Diarrhea
Fatigue

Those diagnosed with Covid-19 either by presentation of symptoms or positive test must quarantine for 10 days whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.

Exposure: The definition of an exposure for quarantine purposes is being within 6 feet of someone diagnosed with Covid-19 for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more, over a 24-hour period.

Exceptions to this rule:

- *Individuals who are fully vaccinated and do not have symptoms do NOT need to quarantine after a close contact. Individuals should get tested 3-5 days after exposure and wear a mask around others until receiving a negative test result.
- * People who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months and recovered and do not have symptoms do NOT have to quarantine.
- * Students who are not fully vaccinated after a close contact in a classroom (or other school setting) if masks were being worn appropriately and consistently by both the person with and the potentially exposed person do NOT need to quarantine.

This is based on updated CDC guidance and studies that have shown extremely low risk of COVID-19 transmission in classroom settings when face masks were being used appropriately by both the person with COVID-19 and the potentially exposed person, as well as multiple layers of prevention measures in place to prevent transmission in school settings. This applies to exposures in classrooms, other in school settings, and school transportation but does not apply to exposures during extracurricular or athletic activities. This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting.

If a student is determined to be exposed then the parent will initially be contacted by phone by the school nurse. If the nurse cannot reach parents by phone they will send an email directing them to call as soon as possible so that we can determine a safe return date.

<u>Quarantine</u>: This is the time spent away from other people by an individual who has been in close contact with someone who is positive with Covid-19. Quarantine guidance for Falls Lake Academy comes from our local health department.

They must complete 14 days of quarantine beginning the day after their last day of contact with the positive individual.

<u>Isolation:</u> When someone tests positive for Covid-19 or is presumed positive based on symptoms, they must isolate themselves from others for a minimum of 10 days.

When diagnosed with Covid-19 via test or symptoms, one must isolate for 10 days regardless of vaccination status.

<u>Testing:</u> If you have a member of your family that has any Covid-19 like symptoms <u>no household member should be at school until it is ruled out</u>. It is very important during these times to keep your student at home when they are sick or not feeling well.

We do not accept any type of at home Covid-19 testing results; the gold standard is a PCR test and this is the most accurate.

<u>Clusters:</u> The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS) defines clusters of COVID-19 in non congregate living settings as:

A minimum of 5 cases with illness onsets or initial positive results within a 14-day period AND Plausible epidemiologic linkage between cases* *

**Cases should be present in the same general setting during the same time period (e.g., same shift, same classroom, same physical area) and there should not be a more likely source of exposure for identified cases (e.g., household or close contact to a confirmed case in another setting).

Guidance is determined by using the Strong Schools NC: Public Health Toolkit (K-12) and the final decision for guidance is directed by our local health department and Board of Directors.

COVID Protocol for Falls Lake Academy:

<u>Face Coverings</u>: All children and staff K-12 are required to wear face coverings while indoors. Students will be given masks breaks in one minute increments throughout the day while stationary and when socially distanced. Outdoors distance should be maintained as much as possible and face coverings are not required. Students and staff in need of a face mask will be provided one.

<u>Vaccination Status:</u> Falls Lake Academy encourages individuals that are eligible to be vaccinated to do so to protect themselves and others. Local vaccination events will be shared as appropriate.

<u>Frequent Hand Washing /Sanitizing:</u> Frequent hand washing will be scheduled in the elementary students' school day. Middle and high school teachers will encourage frequent hand washing / sanitizing to prevent the spread of germs. Hand sanitizer is available in all classrooms and at the main entrance of each building.

<u>Lunch</u>: Students will have their full lunch period to eat their lunch. However, students that need more than 15 minutes to finish eating will be asked to socially distance (6 feet) from other students. Our goal is to protect students from exposure. The duration of the lunch period will not change. Classes should eat outdoors as often as possible.

<u>Morning routines:</u> Elementary students will report directly to their classrooms upon arrival. Elementary students will not be held in the gym until 7:45. Middle school students will be held in the gym and will be socially distanced from 7:15 until 7:35am. High school students will be held in the high school gym socially distanced from 7:45- 8:00am.

<u>Dismissal</u>: Students will be asked to socially distance or wear masks even when outside.

<u>Visitors:</u> No visitors will be permitted indoors during instructional hours during the month of September. Volunteers will be permitted on campus after the instructional day. If you need to check out a student, please call 919-964-9003 and someone will assist you.

<u>Athletics:</u> All sporting events will follow the NCHSAA guidelines. These guidelines can be found at www.nchsaa.org/news/2021-8-3/2021-2022-nchsaa-sports-guidelines-best-practices.

<u>Cleaning/Air Quality:</u> Our classrooms will continue to be sanitized daily using a disinfecting machine along with a wide area ULV atomizing machine for floor to ceiling sanitizing. Hard surfaces are sanitized between groups of students. Air purifiers are placed in all classroom spaces. Larger air purifiers will be placed in gathering spaces. Our school also installed specially designed units (Needlepoint Bipolar Ionization Units) on our air handlers that minimizes the spread of germs and maximizes fresh air flow.

<u>Shared Materials:</u> Students will be asked to wash or sanitize their hands before and after using shared materials in the classroom.

<u>Remote instruction option:</u> At this time, Falls Lake Academy is not offering a remote option. The Academics and Governance Committee of the Board of Directors will be meeting to discuss the current legislation that outlines options Charter Schools have at this time.

<u>Instruction during Quarantine:</u> All instruction will be asynchronous (no face to face time); there will be NO Direct Instruction. All assignments will be found on Google classroom, Jupiter, or Seesaw. Teachers will be available to students on quarantine one day per week via zoom. During the zoom session students will have a chance to ask questions or get assistance as needed. The quarantine zoom schedule will be available on our website. (Different instructional protocols will be enacted during Cluster Quarantines)

Frequently Asked Questions:

What should I do if my child has been exposed to someone with COVID outside the school setting? *Notify your child's teacher AND email Tracey Ruffin, our school nurse. Her email address is traceyruffin@fallslakeacademy.com*. Keep your student at home and await instructions from Ms. Ruffin.

My child is showing symptoms of COVID but his/her siblings are not. Can I still send the others to school? NO, please keep all students in the same household home even if only one is symptomatic. Once a negative test result is acquired, then all siblings may return to school if symptoms have subsided.

How will I know if a child in my child's class has been diagnosed with COVID? All positive cases of COVID are communicated to families through email daily. If a student in your child's classroom has been diagnosed with COVID and your child is considered to be exposed, you will be notified individually with directions for next steps. If your child is not considered exposed, you will not know which classes the cases are located to ensure confidentiality. School level reports are now included in our COVID emails.

How do I know how many positive cases of COVID are at Falls Lake Academy? Falls Lake Academy has a COVID dashboard that is updated daily on our website. This information can be found at www.fallslakeacademy.com.

What happens if a child does not wear a mask appropriately? The staff at Falls Lake Academy will follow the steps below:

- 1. Remind the student to pull up the mask and explain the importance of mask-wearing.
- 2. If a student is still having difficulty wearing the mask appropriately, the student will be sent to the office to obtain a different type of mask to wear.
- 3. If a student still is unable to keep the mask up, the school administrator will make a joint phone call with the student and parent to ensure a safe plan to keep the student and others safe with appropriate mask-wearing technique.
- 4. Continued issues with mask wearing will be considered a disciplinary issue and will be handled as such.

What happens if a staff member refuses to wear a mask? Staff members do not have an option. Any staff member that refuses to wear a mask will be subject to disciplinary action and will not be permitted on campus.

Are quarantine days considered excused absences? Yes, quarantine days are considered excused absences. Make sure to follow the daily protocol from your child's teachers while out for quarantine.

How many students have to get sick before the school will close down? Falls Lake Academy works closely with Granville Vance Public Health. Any and all decisions to quarantine large groups of students would be advised by the health department.

National Suicide Prevention Week

National Suicide Prevention Week is Monday, September 6th through Sunday, September 11th. As always, the Counseling Department is available to support our Falls Lake families throughout the year. For more information visit #BeThe1To, a resource created by the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

How Can You Help Someone?

Ask

Research shows people who are having thoughts of suicide feel relief when someone asks after them in a caring way. Findings suggest acknowledging and talking about suicide may reduce rather than increase suicidal ideation.

Be There

Individuals are more likely to feel less depressed, less suicidal, less overwhelmed, and more hopeful by after speaking to someone who listens without judgment.

Keep Them Safe

A number of studies have indicated that when lethal means are made less available or less deadly, suicide rates by that method decline, and frequently suicide rates overall decline.

Help Them Stay Connected

Studies indicate that helping someone at risk create a network of resources and individuals for support and safety can help them take positive action and reduce feelings of hopelessness.

Follow Up

Studies have also shown that brief, low cost intervention and supportive, ongoing contact may be an important part of suicide prevention, especially for individuals after they have been discharged from hospitals or care services.

Twelve: Twelve is a knowledge-based academic competition that challenges teams of students to answer questions covering a variety of subject areas. The competition is based primarily on the core curriculum. Topics include math, science, history, literature, sports, art, and NC facts.

Twelve teams of twelve students each will tackle twelve topics with twelve questions each. Will your school be one of twelve to compete for the state championship of Twelve?

- * All practices will be virtual; competitions are on 11/20/21 and possibly 12/11/21.
- * Practice will be held once a week, with some "study"-time required in between.

Quiz Bowl: Quiz Bowl is an academic competition in which two teams of four students compete head to head using a buzzer system to be the first to answer questions read by a moderator. The fast-paced format tests the combined prowess of the teams to determine the ultimate winner. (This is trivia of all types - if you know lots of sports or pop culture trivia or if you watch the news every night, you can be super successful here!) We may have between 4-8 members to compete. If we have enough members, we can form a second team. * All practices will be virtual; competitions will also be virtual. Meets will begin in October. Practices will begin in September.

- * Practice will be held once a week, with some "study"-time required in between.
- * Competitions are planned to be virtual.

Quill: Teams of four students must create written products given a prompt from a specific text type. Each student will be assigned a writing prompt within a type of writing (such as Narrative or Problem-Solution). Students have approximately 90 minutes to write an essay in response to the assigned prompt. We may have between 4-8 members to compete. If we have enough, we can form a second team.

- * There will be two practice writing days with feedback given from a team of teachers.
- * Competition dates are 11/3/21 and 12/4/21.
- * Competition is scheduled in person, but that may change.

Battle of the Books: Read books and answer questions as a team! You can see the list of books in the Jupiter message sent to all families.

Competition is scheduled for the spring semester so you have time to read.

Team members are asked to write questions to prepare for competition.

* Practices will begin in the spring semester, but you would need to start reading now.

We must have between 4-6 students to compete.
