## Message from Mrs. Hobgood

Getting the most out of your PAA (personal adult advocate) contacts and parent/teacher conferences:

Dear Parents,

Do you ever get nervous about parent/teacher conferences or PAA calls? Do you ever wish the conversation could have gone better or left with unanswered questions? Here are a few tips to get the most out of your PAA calls or your parent/teacher conferences.

1. Teachers are just people- People that love your kid. Relax, expect the best, and share your honest thoughts and feelings.
2. Your child's success is our priority too. Teachers do this job because they love what they do. We are all on the same team, working towards the same goal. If you or your child need more communication or advocacy from your PAA, speak up and let us know. That is what we are here for.
3. Children are different at school than they are at home, and that is normal. Share things with your PAA that you feel would be helpful at school, and ask questions about what is working and not working at school.
4. Don't limit your questions/concerns to academic issues. Social and emotional health is important to success in school as well.
5. Keep a binder or notebook to record thoughts, feelings, and concerns. Take notes during meetings and follow-up about next steps if needed.
6. None of us are perfect. If the teacher has made a mistake, kindly let them know. If you have made a mistake, talk to the teacher. It happens to all of us. All we can do is apologize and correct it moving forward. Give grace as often as possible.

# COUNSELORS CORNER





October is Disability Awareness Month. An estimated 48.9 million people in the USA have a disability. Almost 1/3 of families in America are impacted by disability.

In the not so distant past, individuals with disabilities were denied the opportunity to attend public school. Programs and opportunities for these individuals were quite limited. However, in 1975, the Education for all Handicapped Act was passed, ensuring a Free and Appropriate Public Education for children with physical and/or mental disabilities. This legislation has been amended and is now known as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. This piece of legislation has provided the opportunity for students to obtain a quality educational experience.

Each and every day, we interact with individuals with disabilities – whether we realize it or not. People with dyslexia, autism, vision and hearing impairments, are in our community – contributing to the betterment of society. Disability awareness month provides an opportunity for us to learn about different types of disabilities, appreciate those that are differently abled and advocate for those people with disabilities that are part of our society.

Please take an opportunity this month to appreciate the contributions of individuals with disabilities such as: Franklin D. Roosevelt, who contracted Polio in 1921. President Roosevelt used a wheelchair throughout his presidency, however he would utilize steel leg braces for public appearances, so that he could stand, so as not to appear weak and feeble to the American Public.

Tom Cruise, who is dyslexic, and despite this has won 3 Golden Globe Awards.

Marlee Maitlin, who is deaf, and won an Academy Award for her role in Children of a Lesser God.

Patricia Polacco, a children's author and illustrator, who was diagnosed with Dyslexia, Dysnumeria and Dysgraphia and did not learn to read until age 14.
