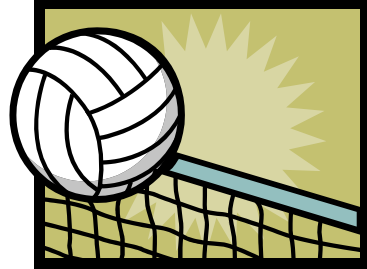
Afternoon Checkout

Anyone who's been in our office trailer in the late afternoon knows that it's a complete madhouse. So many things, and so many people, come together between 2:00 and 3:00 that it generally takes the whole office staff, including Dr. D and Ms. Maxson, to handle the traffic, phone calls, and people who come in. Lunch Duty Volunteers

Parents: if you sign up for lunch duty, please, PLEASE don't leave us hanging! Unlike the traditional public schools, we don't have anybody we can "pull" from their regular duties to handle lunch distribution if you don't show up! Four times in the last two weeks we've had two or more lunch volunteers fail to show up without letting us know they weren't coming. When that happens, we either have to pull teacher assistants out of the classrooms, send the office staff down the hall to handle it (leaving the office and phone uncovered, which really annoys and irritates parents who try to call in or come by to handle their school-related business on their lunch breaks), and/or use who we have and just take twice as long to give lunches out, which causes the students to miss instruction to stand in line and wait. It's a big deal: don't bail on us at lunchtime – we need you!
