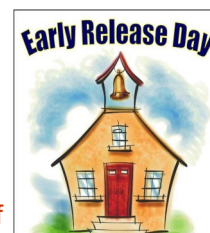
*Anyway, it looks like things are going to calm down for a little while now. Or ... are they? Read on to find out .*

# About Homework Club

Since FLA opened in August, we've offered academic assistance and a safe, quiet place for students to study three afternoons each week when Homework Club is held on the middle school hallway from right after school until about 4:15. Homework Club has become so popular that it's in danger of losing its focus, so we have been obliged to forge some rules. ***The following Homework Club regulations and procedures went into effect last week and are in effect from now on,*** barring further action to the contrary:

- Homework Club is not FAST (Firebird After School Time), nor is it a babysitting service: Homework Club is for students who need a place and time to study, and/or some informal tutoring help. Students are NOT to be "sent" to Homework Club by parents when they are going to be picked up late; picking up students after school by 3:30 is the responsibility of all FLA parents, and students who are not picked up by then will be sent to FAST. Parents will be billed at the regular weekly rate when that happens.
- Likewise, students who finish other FLA after-school extracurricular activities before 4:15 are not to be sent to HW Club to wait for their rides.
- Students will *only* be permitted entrance to Homework Club when they are approved by their teacher. Teachers will send a list of students approved for Homework Club each day to the HW Club coordinator (Mr. Decker or Ms. Cunningham). Teachers can approve students for HW Club at the student's request or at the student's parents' request, but only FLA teachers and administrators can approve students for HW Club on any given day.
- Students may only come to HW Club when they have an assignment from an FLA teacher or something they plan to study on their own. Students who show up without something to work on, even with the approval of a teacher, will not be allowed entrance.
- Students in HW Club are expected to stay until 4:15 (may stay as long as 4:30 if they are working steadily and wish to stay that long). HW Club students' rides must pick them up by 4:30 or they will be sent to FAST; again, parents will be billed at the regular weekly rate when that happens.
- Parents who come to pick up students in HW Club between 3:15 and 4:15 must come to the office and have those students called up by the secretary; parents may not go down the hall unannounced and take a student out of HW Club without authorization. Nor may students pack up and leave HW Club before 4:15 without authorization. Students in HW Club will NOT be allowed to leave and wait outside for parents who tell them to "be ready" to be picked up at any time before 4:15.
- Teachers are assigned to HW Club every day it is open: Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday 3:15-4:15 (4:30 latest). They can and will all help students who need help in whatever subjects are needed, but our teachers are all subject-area specialists with more expertise in some areas than in others. Students who want special extra help and/or tutoring in certain subjects are strongly encouraged to find out which afternoons one or more specialists in the areas in which they need help are scheduled to cover HW Club in order to get the best possible help when they need it.
- Middle school (and a very few upper-elementary school) students who excel at one or more academic subject areas can earn required School and Community Service hours' credit by tutoring during HW Club. Students who think they can handle that kind of peer-tutoring responsibility should see Mr. Decker or Ms. Cunningham to volunteer to tutor one or more afternoons per week.

Take advantage of Homework Club: it is potentially one of the strongest tools we have in our toolbox to help students excel academically. With the establishment of these rules, we hope it will be even stronger!

## FLAP Officer Contacts

Are you bewildered about who to contact when, to talk about what - - - ? Here's a key to understanding the parent support organizational structure:

FLAP (**F**alls **L**ake Academy **P**arents) is the "big" parent organization that ALL Firebird parents belong to, just because you have a child at FLA. The PTA (**P**arent-**T**eacher **A**ssociation) is a smaller parent group associated with the state PTA that includes only those parents who join and pay their \$4.00 dues. The PAC (**P**arent **A**dvisory **C**ouncil) is the "steering committee" for both parent groups; it's made up of one parent elected from each grade. They're called "grade-level representatives," or "parent reps" for short. The eight parent reps who make up the PAC organize and manage the business, activities, and events of FLAP and the PTA. Each parent rep has an officer title as well, as you can see from this:
