**Special Note:** Typically, parents can earn volunteer hours' credit for a school year all the way through June 30<sup>th</sup> of that year, even after classes officially end for kids. Parent volunteer hours earned in the summer "switch over" to the new school year on July 1<sup>st</sup>.

## School and Community Service Hours

**Please remember that completion of at least 10 approved School and Community Service Hours is a condition of grade promotion at FLA.** Students who don't complete 10 approved hours cannot be promoted. If you are not sure whether or not your child has completed his or her hours, or if you need to get an activity pre-approved for hours' credit, or if you're panicking and need help finding an event or activity that will give your child the hours he or she needs, please contact your child's PAA immediately for answers!

## Dress Code

As the weather gets warmer and the sun gets brighter, every school in the country begins to have issues with student compliance with dress code provisions. It's generally true that the older the students, the more the issue pops up. But even elementary school kids are sometimes guilty of pushing the limits when it comes to dress codes. Board policy #4.3600 includes the FLA dress code:

Students are to be attired in clothing that is appropriate for school and for the specific grade level to which they are assigned. When they are not, their parents will be contacted to bring appropriate replacement attire. The following clothing is **NOT** in compliance with these expectations **and is subject to the Principal's interpretation:**

- Hats or non-medical head coverings worn indoors.
- Dark glasses, masks, or any other items which conceal any part of the face.
- Clothing which is clearly intended for wear at places other than school (pajamas, bathing suits, workout clothes, etc.)
- Slogans, symbols, printed text, and/or illustrations which are inappropriate for school (including gang symbols or references to violent and/or otherwise inappropriate clubs or organizations).
- Jewelry and/or accessories that create an atmosphere non-conducive to learning or that can be used as a weapon or which hinders or restricts free movement.
- Overly revealing or provocative clothing (including too-short shorts, skirts, or dresses and too-low tops, shirts, or blouses).
- Visible undergarments.
- Sagging pants or pants worn with the waistband below the waist and/or low on or underneath the buttocks.
- Shirts designed to be worn tucked-in that are worn untucked to hide sagging pants.

## Parenting for the EOG

1. Early to bed on the night before the tests.
2. Good breakfast on the morning of the tests, but not much sugar! And also, not too much food.
3. Get here on time – the state doesn't allow us to wait for late arrivals, and you don't want your child to be required to do a makeup test after school is out.
4. Bring 2 or 3 pre-sharpened #2 pencils on test mornings.
5. Don't stress your child out over the tests! Kids react much more strongly to the way the adults in their lives act than to what they say. Be positive and happy – the tests are important, but they aren't life and death.

## Dismissal Time

Parents, please be reminded that we now dismiss at 3:10pm in order to make up enough time from missed snow days so we do NOT have to add days to the end of the year. It's important that we keep to this schedule in order to stay in compliance with State Board of Education regulations. Please help us out by keeping patient at the end of the day, and remember that we really must insist that all students stay in school all the way through the 3:10 dismissal time at the end of the day. ## High School Plan

After much discussion, the FLA Board of Directors has approved the operational and educational plan for Falls Lake Academy High School, which will open its doors with its first entering freshman class in August, 2015.
