

Dear Spartan Community:

Since I last reported to you, I have been the recipient of wonderful news related to our students and programs and I am proud to share these accomplishments with you:

- *Hanna Vaidya has been named a Finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Program. Of the 16,000 Semifinalists named in September, 2019, she has met all of the requirements to advance to Finalist standing in the competition. All Finalists will be considered for National Merit Scholarships to be offered later this school year.*



- DePaul Catholic High School has earned the *College Board's AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award*. This was presented to DePaul for attaining female student representation in AP Computer Science and helping to close the gender gap in computer science in 2019. Out of 20,000 institutions that offer AP courses, 818 have earned the award. DePaul Catholic High School is one of only 639 to be recognized for achieving this important result in AP Computer Science Principles.
- In September, 2020, the SAT Prep Course that is taken by all juniors during Marking Period 1, will be offered by *The Princeton Review*. Being able to secure the services of this nationally recognized organization will be an added benefit to all students. We are proud to offer an overview of the DePaul Catholic Princeton Review SAT class presented by Robert Franek, the Editor in Chief of Princeton Review. Robert Franek is a nationally known expert on higher education issues and directs The Princeton Review annual surveys of colleges and universities throughout the United States. The Princeton Review overview will be held on Monday, March 9, 2020 at 7:00 PM. All parents of all grade-levels are invited to this informative evening.

Chores

A missed opportunity for some kids..... and parents

Growing up with 2 brothers was an adventure, wrestling matches, headlocks, boxing gloves, sports, school and yes, chores.

We hated chores. Make your bed. Wash the car. Mow the grass. Help paint the house. Weed the garden. Put down the fertilizer. Vacuum. Take out the trash. Shovel the driveway and the sidewalk and the old lady's driveway next door. I remember my father standing at the bottom of the ladder one day and telling me I missed a spot while painting. I did not appreciate the comment.

We all had jobs. These were jobs you could not get fired from. Mom and Dad had a "no fire policy". Their policy was to say, "do it again, the right way". We hated it, but we did it. We learned from it.

Nothing better on a 90 degree day in the summer than mowing the grass. Nothing better than washing the car, several times in a row, because you missed a spot. Now our car was a '59 VW so it was small but 3 times in a row is crazy. "Do it again, the right way", Mom said!

Then we got older and could drive. At first we borrowed the family car, but that meant refilling the tank with gas when we used it. My Father was an engineer and he could calculate how much gas was used. It drove us crazy and made us broke. But we did not joy ride and could not speed as the horsepower of a '59 VW was a whopping 36 horses.

Then my friend bought a car. A '63 Comet that was completely falling apart. We learned how to fix it. Clothes hangers and muffler tape to hold up the muffler. Oil changes, tire changes. Used tires we bought for \$2.00 at Firestone. Replacing the cracked back window. All to keep the car running. That '63 Comet made it to Seaside, LBI, Wildwood and Cape Cod many times.

I bought my first car using the \$25.00 Savings Bonds I had received for 18 years from my grandmother. The car was \$350.00 '64 Dodge Dart. Indestructible. I bought it with 65,000 on the odometer and put another 70,000 on while I had it. It finally just rusted away, but I could basically fix everything. In fact, on my first day teaching at DePaul in October of 1976 I had to climb out the window when I arrived at school because the doors were rusted shut. The kids saw me climbing out and then had me as a teacher. A bad start for me.

So what is the point of all this reminiscing?

The point is that sometimes we sell our kids short by doing everything for them. Chores, such as mowing the grass, help to teach a work ethic, plus parents, if your high school student gets home too late, a great punishment is to get your night owl up early to cut the grass. Your child will learn a lesson without you yelling at them or grounding them. Kids need to learn the dignity of work from their parents. Not just working for money, but working to help the family. They need to do chores, fix things, ask for help, to tackle and solve a problem, and do things right.

So, maybe a few of the things that parents pay others to do around the home should be done by the children. Teaching a work ethic is important. Teaching a child to do the work they hate is even more important. (Homework for example.)

By the way, my brothers and I did our chores and still had time for participation in sports, to drive my parents crazy and to just hang out... Just like your child is doing or could do, we learned to balance our time.

Happy car washing and try the "no fire" policy!

New Turf Planned for Alumni Field

Our athletic field, known as "Alumni Field," is an important part of life here at DePaul Catholic. It's home to seven different sports for both girls and boys teams; softball, baseball, soccer and lacrosse for both genders, and football. These teams use Alumni Field for practice and for contests against other schools. Some of them compete at three levels: varsity, junior varsity and freshmen. Our gym classes use the field as well. And so it sees lots of activity, resulting in lots of wear and tear.



The current turf was installed in 2008, and has now reached the end of its useful life. Recent testing has convinced us that we should replace it, and we have taken steps to do that. After receiving bids from three reputable vendors, our Board of Trustees has selected Field Turf, Inc. to help us. Field Turf was the obvious choice: in addition to submitting the lowest bid, it already enjoys a positive relationship with our school due to its previous engagements here, one we can build on once more.

We expect that this work will begin as soon as this school year is finished, and we look forward to our new field being ready in time for our fall teams to use in September.

8th Grade Retreat


