WASHINGTON—Pope Francis has accepted the resignation of Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli, 75, from the pastoral governance of the Diocese of Paterson and has named Father Kevin J. Sweeney, a priest of the Diocese of Brooklyn as Bishop-elect of Paterson.

The appointment was publicized in Washington, D.C. on April 15, 2020 by Archbishop Christophe Pierre, apostolic nuncio to the United States.

Bishop-elect Sweeney was born on January 17, 1970 in Elmhurst, New York and was ordained to the priesthood on June 28, 1997 for the Diocese of Brooklyn. Father Sweeney graduated from St. John's University, Queens, New York in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts and received a Master of Divinity from Immaculate Conception Seminary in Huntington, New York in 1997.

Father Sweeney's assignments in the Diocese of Brooklyn after ordination include: Parochial Vicar at St. Nicholas of Tolentine Parish in Jamaica (1997-2003); Coordinator of the Irish Apostolate (1999-2001); Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of Sorrows, Corona (2003-2004); Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Brooklyn (2004-2010); Chaplain at Bishop Loughlin Memorial High School, Brooklyn (2005); Administrator at St. Michael Parish, Brooklyn (2010-2012); Spiritual Director at Jovenes de Valor (2010-2013). His service includes membership on the Seminary Admissions Board (2010-present); Presbyteral Council (2011-2016); Dean of the Brooklyn 8 Deanery (2013-present); Vocations Representative (2014-present); and the Priest Personnel Assignment Board (2017-present). Bishop-elect Sweeney, who speaks both English and Spanish, is currently Pastor

As teachers continue to present online lessons, I hope people outside the education world are appreciative and supportive. Lots of hours of prep go into each lesson and lots of hours go into correcting the papers and other submissions by the students.

The hardest thing a teacher faces now, is making sure all the students are doing their work on a timely basis no matter what grade, no matter how old they are.

This is where supportive parents are vital. Please, check your child's daily work, not just their final grade (by that time it is too late). Check the assignments as posted by the teacher. Hold your child as accountable as your boss holds you for duties at work.

Why? Because when we get back to normal, your child needs to be prepared to move forward without finding themselves behind and trying to catch up.

Now I understand parents are also under stress, I get it. **However, when you signed on to parenthood you did not sign on for easy.** Parenting is hard and that is why proper parenting is so exhausting (there is no finish line). There are no "do-overs" in raising kids.

Prayer and patience help a lot. Both work to assist you in raising your children.

The place to begin

Men: Jesus needs you

Mary, our Mother, said, “My spirit rejoices in God my savior, for He has looked with favor on His lowly servant.” And because of Mary’s perfect YES, our salvation, our King, our love, Jesus, came into the world and remains with us.

These words from Luke chapter 1 are the words which Mary herself used to explain her incredible experience to Elizabeth, and they are also the words men use to express the honor of serving Him as His priest. Can you feel the power of these words?

Now this is not a plea for numbers. We should never desire to live a vocation other than the one God desires for us. But for many reasons, the total number of priests (diocesan and religious) in the United States has dropped 37% over the past 53 years, from 59,000 in 1965 to 37,000 in 2018.

Men, we live in a culture, described by Pope Francis, where everything is provisional or temporary; where people are encouraged to pursue their dreams, but leave a “door open” in case it doesn’t work out; where “self-realization” is measured by money and power not by fidelity to the Gospel and Gospel values. Can you feel the power of those words?

At the end of our lives, the only thing we will take with us is our relationship with God, everything else stays. Our relationship with God is the only thing that matters, it is the only thing that will EVER matter.

Marriage is a beautiful vocation and many of us are called to it. But it is not the default. There is no default vocation. God’s desire for us is uniquely ours and it is made known to us if we only listen and embrace His love. But, what does it mean to love God?

If you love someone you want to do what they care about. Love is not passive. If God is Love, then all He wants to do is bring goodness into peoples’ lives. So we love God by taking part in His effort of loving, by taking part in what God brings into peoples’ lives.

We accomplish this by surrendering our will to His. We make what is good and true the most important matters that we are concerned with in our own lives, and we do them intentionally. We ask ourselves, “What are the ways that I can behave that are better aligned with the Lord’s love.” That is loving God.

Men, how will you align yourselves with the Lord’s love? Does fidelity to the Gospel and Gospel values sound good “for someone else” or is it something you can build your life around? Can you surrender your will to the God of Love?

“My spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has looked with favor on His lowly servant.” It all begins with these words... our Mother’s words... our words.




