Raising Confident, Independent Children

Raising Confident , Independent Children

The following information is from a new book “The Scaffold Effect-Raising Resilient, Self Reliant, and Secure Kids in an age of Anxiety” by Harold S. Koplewicz, MD

Just as sturdy scaffolding is necessary when erecting a building but will come down as the structure grows stable, good parenting provides children with steady, warm, emotional nourishment on the path toward independence. Never-ending parental problem solving and involvement can have the opposite effect, enabling fragility and anxiety over time. This clinically tested idea that is deliberate build-up and then gradual loosening of parental support is the single most effective way to encourage kids to climb higher, try new things and grow from mistakes and to develop character and strength.

The whole idea is to build from a strong foundation to setting limits. Strategies are needed to raise empowered, capable kids while building parent-child bonds that will survive adolescence and grow strong into adulthood.

Good parenting is not about rescuing kids. When kids are young, parents are fixers, protectors and social secretaries. From child proofing the house to setting up playdates, throwing their parties to calling their teachers when there is a problem. There comes a point along the way that the parents’ job changes, without warning or indication, to becoming consultants. The new job is to help them find solutions for themselves. This grows from fixing a scraped knee to helping them solve problems. There is no instant fix to a social rejection problem or a failed experience.

If a child gets a poor grade on a test, for example, a fix-it parent would say “ you should talk to the teacher or you should study harder.” Choosing and handing him the tools. To scaffold, parents support and encourage the child to learn how to choose the right tool for the particular task all by himself. He might choose wrong, and then the parent can guide him to evaluate why that particular tool wasn’t the best choice. Next time, he’ll try something new. It is important that you stand by collaborating with them to come up with their own solutions.

It is best to help children build confidence, a comfort zone, where they feel safe and secure, is in control and can do any social, emotional, behavioral, or academic task easily. However, maximum learning and growth happens just outside of the comfort zone, where the child reaches and stretches to acquire new skills. Learning/growth is an ongoing process of reaching for more, and is always empowered by parent-child collaboration. You are in it together.

Once your child learns what he needs to learn, he can move on, and up, to the next level while you cheer him on from a distance. Encourage them to take risks, despite the real possibility of failure. If you want kids to be more proactive and prosocial, you have to praise them when they try. Be careful of what you praise. If you praise success, your kids learn to think failure is bad. But, failure isn’t good or bad. Just one possible outcome.

Once we take the anxiety out of possible failure it allows productivity and growth.





Language Department Semester Projects
