Being Accepted

There are many ways to know you've been accepted.

In the Fall of 1966, I took the entrance test for admission into DePaul Diocesan High

School, now known as DePaul Catholic.

I remember at that time there was a book to study prior to the test and my mom gave me the old, "study or no dinner" order. It was always a persuasive argument to get me to do something. (The all time best was when she ordered, "wash your father's car or no dinner". Thank God the car was a '59 VW Beetle. I washed the car. She inspected. I washed it again. She inspected. I washed it again, passed the inspection and had dinner.)

But I digress...

In January 1967, I received the word that I had been accepted into the Class of '71 at DePaul.

No fanfare; no Signing Day; no announcement that I was taking my exceptional talents to DePaul. I really didn't have any exceptional talents to bring.

(I barely knew where DePaul was even though I grew up a mile away.)

I did get a hearty handshake from my father and then a warning...

It went like this "you know John, sending you to DePaul is a great sacrifice for your mother and me. We could easily send you to Wayne High School". (I wanted to go there at first with my friend, Lenny.) As it was then and continues to be today, Wayne has great high schools, public and private. My father said the only thing I needed to do was to do my best while at DePaul. That meant, good grades, get involved and be respectful to the Sisters and the teachers.

If I did that, then he and mom would have no problem footing the tuition bill **It was \$200.00 a year.** I used to take a \$20.00 bill to Mrs. McGrath in the Main Office each month who, in turn, would give it to Sister Margaret Veronica to send to the bank. The bank never recounted the cash that Sister Margaret brought in. No need to.

Being accepted into DePaul was a big deal, but it also forced the family to make a decision about school. I did not have much say in the decision, but of course it was: Go be a "Spartan".

We are in the middle of Admissions Season here in 2021. We have already reached 85% of our enrollment goal for the Class of 2025 and new applications keep coming in.

It is pleasing and rewarding and the result of everyone's hard work here at school and parents seeing the value in Catholic Education, A DePaul Catholic Education.

By March 1st, I believe we will achieve our enrollment goals and then begin the process of officially welcoming the Class of 2025.

There will be an Orientation, some placement tests, sign ups for Fall Sports, summer cheerleading practice for freshman cheerleaders, summer practices for Fall Sports, summer camps for future Spartans, and hopefully some time to rest and recoup as we get ready to wind it up again for the Labor Day start of school.

I hope the new students who have already enrolled, or will soon enroll, are as excited as I was back in 1967. I hope their experience will be as good as mine was. I hope that after they register they remain a Spartan for the rest of their lives.

For those of you that have yet to enroll into the Class of 2025, it is time to move forward and complete your registration paperwork.

I wouldn't want you to miss out on being a member of the Class of 2025.





