A message from the President For our Spartan Senior Citizens

If, like me, you've reached the hallowed age of 70 and a half years (70 1/2), and have also been lucky enough to put some money away in an IRA, you are now subject to the rules that govern the Required Minimum Distribution ("RMD"). The RMD is a certain amount that Uncle Sam insists you withdraw from your IRA each year which he'll count as part of your income for that year and tax it. But to avoid income tax on part or all of your RMD, you can designate those dollars as a Qualified Charitable Distribution ("QCD") and avoid federal taxes altogether. So, for example, if your RMD for a given year is \$10,000, you could designate \$2,000, say, as a contribution to your favorite 501(c)(3) charity and owe federal income tax on just \$8,000. This is a particularly useful move, since the changes made in the tax code that have limited the deductibility of state and local taxes while at the same time raising the standard deduction. By using a QCD, a taxpayer can claim the standard deduction and still get the benefit of her/his charitable donations, effectively reducing her/his tax liability while helping a favored organization.

Now for the "ask:" Some of you may still have to take your RMD for 2019. If you're in that group, I ask that you consider making a QCD with DePaul Catholic as the beneficiary. Ditto for everyone, for next year, and the years thereafter, when you'll have to take more RMDs. By doing so, you can (probably) help yourself while helping DePaul, a win all around - except, of course, for our Uncle in DC.

A caveat: while I'm a lawyer, I'm not a tax lawyer, so you should speak with your own tax professional before taking any action along these lines. Certain terms and limitations apply, and you'll want to ensure that they've been addressed in your particular case. Should you need any information from us, just let me know.

Dear Spartan Community:

On Monday night, October 28, I was honored to accompany 10 of our students to the Tri-County Scholarship Fund 38th Annual Awards Dinner at the Hanover Marriott. If you are unfamiliar with the

work of Tri-County, they are an organization that raises money for the sole purpose of distributing academic scholarships to students who live in the Paterson Diocese and attend Catholic/private schools. 58 DePaul Catholic High School students receive this scholarship, which is \$4,000 per student, and totals \$232,000 received in financial assistance from the Tri-County Scholarship Fund. Attending this dinner was a great opportunity for the students to mingle and have conversation with the many supporters who care about providing educational opportunities for students in the Diocese of Paterson.



On November 1, the first marking period of the school year came to a close. When I addressed the students at our All Saints Day Mass, I asked them if they had accomplished 25% of their goals and, if they had not, what corrective actions were they taking to reach these goals. I always remind the students that the school year is a marathon and not a sprint. You cannot decide in May that you want to be successful...it is a yearlong endeavor.


