



Student Financial Assistance Fund



What is the Student Financial Assistance Fund (SFAF)?

The Waunakee Community School District is committed to ensuring that all students and families can participate in their school communities regardless of a family's financial situation and ability to pay.

Scholarships or payment plans are available to any student who has been approved for the free/reduced meal program, and may be available to any student whose families have a financial need due to unique circumstances.



When was the SFAF created?

The Waunakee Community School District made a financial commitment to start a Student Financial Assistance Fund that can support families in need in September of 2018.

The Waunakee Board of Education annually contributes \$5,000 to the fund, with the remaining funds coming from donations from the community.



Who makes up the SFAF Committee?

A district-wide committee, including representatives from the Board of Education (BOE), administrators, staff, and students, has been created to establish guidelines for this work. The committee is lead by Jessica Moehn, district social worker.

The Committee and Student Financial Assistance Fund is focused on Waunakee students who qualify for free and reduced lunch and families who are experiencing a financial crisis.

The Student Financial Assistance Fund Committee meets once per month. Depending on the needs of the community and the balance of the fund, the Committee discusses how often and when to widely ask for donations to the Classmunity.



How does someone request assistance from the Fund?

What does the SFAF provide for families and students?

Donations will be used to fund need-based scholarships for activities such as:

- School-Sponsored Activities and Field Trips
- Scholarships
- Food Service Assistance
- Contribution to Ala Carte Program for all 7th-12th grade qualifying students
- Co-Curricular activity fees
- Memory Books/Yearbooks
- Class and School T-Shirts
- Other District-Sponsored Activities That Requires Fees
