lear Parents/Legal Guardians:

our child attends the Intermediate School, which receives Federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement tandards. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law and your child's ducation. This letter lets you know about your right to request information about the qualifications of the classroom staff rorking with your child.

the Intermediate School, we are very proud of our teachers and feel they are ready for the coming school year and are repared to give your child a high-quality education. As a Title I school, we must meet federal regulations related to teacher ualifications as defined in ESEA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your child's teachers' training credentials. Ve are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching.
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

'ou may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can rovide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

he Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December, 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additionally right to know requests. At any time, parents and family nembers can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - o Subject matter tested,
 - o Purpose of the test,
 - o Sources of the requirements (if applicable),
 - o Amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - o Time and format of disseminating results.

Dur staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in chool and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable 'ennsylvania state requirements.
