PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Selma City Schools will analyze key achievement and demographic data and assess safety needs. A survey was deployed to determine needs followed by a session designed to specifically prioritize the needs. The needs include: technology, additional staff to prep for reopening and safety protocols, sanitation/health supplies and services, virtual admin/management processes, PD (virtual learning, cleaning, SEL), selfcare and employee assistance program.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services

Midyear Performance Series data was used to identify the 5 overall weakest standards in ELA and Math as well as individual student needs. Data was used to design summer learning. Edgenuity and i-Ready will be used for progress monitoring and assessment. Flexibility within areas such as scheduling, virtual options, support, and services will allow us to meet the diverse needs of our scholars.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

April/May - Planning

June/July -Targeted student support ans staff PD; Consult with private schools August 2020 - May 2021 - The School year will inlude continuous monitoring and support with quarterly review of data/needs with adjustments as necessary. All funds will be expended prior to September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Selma City will ensure that all students have access to devices with cameras and microphones. New devices will have built-in connectivity. Teachers will receive training on virtual learning technology integration into content. The system is updating the broadcast lab to allow for the production of quality content. The system is also planning felxible scheduling to include both hybrid and 100% virtual options.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

Services will be used to provide digital assements and content. Services will also be used to support student access to remote/virtual learning. Service and assistance will begin upon application approval and conclue by September 30, 2022.

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.

 (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances
