Community: Scarborough is located on the scenic coast of southern Maine on Wabanaki land, six miles southwest of Portland, with approximately 20,000 residents. Scarborough continues to be a growing community. Scarborough has a diverse commercial base in medical, technical, tourism, agricultural, and fishing. Scarborough High School offers courses and activities to students in grades 9-12 and has one of Maine's most extensive academic, athletic, and extracurricular programs.

School: Scarborough High School strives to provide a safe and inclusive learning environment where each and every student is empowered to be a resilient, lifelong learner who is prepared to engage as a contributing member of society. We are a public comprehensive high school serving the town of Scarborough, ME. SHS operates on an alternating block semester schedule. With over 900 students in grades 9th through 12th and 134 faculty and staff supporting each student to reach their potential.

Curriculum: We offer students a rigorous learning experience, with opportunities for movement into more challenging coursework. Students are not limited to the number of AP or honors courses they may enroll in. There is something for everybody; from a recently updated STEM program to a thriving visual and performing arts program, our students are able to explore their interests and passions.

Advanced Placement: 21 AP courses are available at SHS and are considered to be our most rigorous courses offered. Art (Studio) • Biology • Calculus AB & BC • Chemistry • Computer Science • Economics • English Language • English Literature • Environmental Science • French • Government & Politics • Human Geography • Latin Prose & Poetry • Music Theory • Physics C • Psychology • Spanish • Statistics • US History • World History Honors: 29 honors courses are offered across the curriculum, allowing students to challenge themselves.

Career & Technical Education: Partnering with Portland School of Arts and Technology (PATHS) and Westbrook Regional Vocational Centers (WRVC), students in grades 11th and 12th are able to gain valuable skills and learning experiences.

Dual Enrollment: Students can enroll in college-level courses sponsored by the University of Maine system and the Maine Community College System.

Career Pathways: Students explore career interests and experiential learning opportunities through connections with local professionals, businesses, and community partners in their field of interest. Informational interviews, job shadows, group job site visits, guest speaker programs, and internships encompass the opportunities available to SHS students.

Covid-19 Information

March 2020: SHS moved to remote instruction and a Pass/Fall grading system for Semester 2 of 2019-20. This addressed the potential inequity of learning environments, technology barriers, and individual circumstances.

2020-2021: Students had the option to stay remote or a hybrid schedule, attending in-person classes 2 days per week and remote instruction $2\frac{1}{2}$ days per week. We returned to the traditional numeric system of grading.

2021- Current: Students returned to full days of instruction on a block schedule.
