

All Staff and Volunteer Roles and Responsibilities

1. Practice Routine Precautions—such as good hand hygiene, using appropriate gloves when toileting a child, cough into your sleeve. Use any personal protective equipment as appropriate to the task.
2. Report confirmed cases of Infectious Disease when reported to you to your supervisor.
3. Place “Soiled Toys” in the appropriate bin after use with a client.
4. Follow all policies, procedures and programs set forth by the KidsAbility Leadership Team.
5. Follow the recommended guidelines given by the Director of Medical Services or designate when provided.
6. Participate in a self audit hand hygiene survey when asked.
7. Review the Hand Hygiene and Best Prevention Practices for Infection Control during the employee’s annual review.

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INFECTION CONTROL PUTS SAFETY FIRST

- If you are sick please reschedule appointments and stay home.
- Get immunized; talk to your doctor.
- Don’t share drinking cups or toothbrushes.
- Clean the toys with soap and water; don’t share toys if you are sick.
- Use alcohol-based hand sanitizers when you see others.
- Cough & sneeze into your sleeve !
