# COLLEGE REGISTRATION

- In Fall (1st semester) = Spring AVC Registration
- In Spring (2nd semester) = Fall & Summer AVC Registration
  
- When you register for AVC classes:
  - College Classes CANNOT conflict with your high school schedule
  - MUST be registered in at least 1 academic course in Fall & Spring to be a SOAR student

# COLLEGE REGISTRATION CONT...

## Freshman Specifics

- **ONLY** one of the required foundational courses (HD101 or LIB101) and one PE course (KINF or DA) per semester are allowed in your Freshman year.
- **AVC Summer Course (after 9th grade):** must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in high school and college in order to take 1 AVC course

## Sophomore Specifics

- **Limited to 6 units** at AVC per semester.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA required to take more than 1 AVC course.
- Would discourage taking any Communications courses during this year.
- **AVC Summer Courses (after 10th grade):** Minimum 2.5 GPA is required to take 1 course and minimum 3.0 to take 2 AVC courses. **Max units allowed=6.**



# COLLEGE REGISTRATION CONT...

## Junior Specifics

- **Limited to 9 units** at AVC per semester.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA to take more than 1 AVC course.
- **AVC Summer Courses (after 11th grade):** Minimum 2.5 GPA is required to take 1 course and minimum 3.0 to take more than 1 AVC courses. **Max units allowed=9.**

## Senior Specifics

- **Limited to 11.5 units** at AVC per semester. Minimum 3.0 GPA to take more than 1 AVC course.
- If a college course is being taken to meet a high school graduation requirement, the student must meet with their high school counselor.
- High school graduation requirements cannot be completed at AVC during the spring semester of a student's senior year.

# COLLEGE REGISTRATION CONT...

## AVC Summer Session

- In order to take a Summer AVC course you **MUST** have a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA in high school and college. (9th grade = 3.0 requirement)
- In order to register for more than 1 Summer AVC course you **MUST** have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average in high school and college. (9th grade is limited to 1 summer class ONLY if they qualify)

## Online, Evening & Palmdale Classes

- If you take an online, night, or Palmdale course permission is required.
- ***Freshman are EXCLUDED from taking these classes.***

# REQUIRED FOUNDATION COURSES - 9TH GRADE

- HD 101 - College & Life Management
- Lib 101 - Intro to Academic Library Research

\*\*NOTE: These MUST be completed BEFORE moving on to other academic AVC courses.

# WITHDRAWALS &/OR DROPS

**What happens if I have to Drop or Withdraw from an AVC course after college registration closes?**

- **Must complete an AVC Drop Request (see Mrs. Moya if needed)**
- **You may be charged a \$50 drop fine**

# PAYING FINE AND FEES

- The Student Health Fee (\$19) + the Student Representation Fee (\$2) for a total of \$21 must be paid each semester (by 11:30pm the day you register for college classes) to avoid being dropped from your college courses
- College fees (library fines or parking permits) pay in AVC Cashier's office
- SOAR fines (drop fine & late textbook fine) pay in T-700E (Dr. Zimmerman's office)

# TEXTBOOKS

- ALL college textbooks must be returned by Monday following the end of the term
  - Prior to return date - return instructions will be emailed.
  - Less than a week late =  
**\$25 fine per class**
  - More than a week late =  
**the FULL cost of the each late book**

# WHAT IF I GET A "D" OR AN "F" AS A FINAL GRADE IN A CLASS?

## **In College:**

- Must retake the course the following semester (or summer)
- You may be required to pay for the textbook

## **In high school:**

- Must retake the course in summer school (if applicable)

# MANDATORY ACADEMIC SUPPORT (MAS)

## How do I get on MAS?

- Your GPA from the previous semester is below a 2.5 (SOAR) or below a 2.0 (AVC)
- 9th grade - if at progress report time you have any D or F's
- 10th - 12th grade: if at quarter report card time you have any D's or F's

## What happens if I get placed on MAS?

- You are on MAS for the entire semester
- You are only allowed to enroll in ONE academic college course
- You must complete a certain amount of hours on MAS
- If you do not improve after the semester, then you may have to leave the SOAR program

***\*\*You MUST maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA for high school and a 2.0 cumulative GPA in college in order to continue to attend SOAR High School\*\****



# OTHER REQUIREMENTS AND BEST PRACTICES

- California Promise Grant fee waivers must be submitted every year before the deadline.
- If you have to miss class, make sure that SOAR knows, AVC knows, and your teachers (both HS & AVC) know.
  - There are no “excused” absences for AVC
  - You can be dropped from your college class for missing multiple sessions. Please check your syllabus for class policy.
- ALWAYS have you AVC ID while conducting college business
- Check your AVC and High School emails DAILY

# GRADUATION GOALS @ SOAR

## #1 - Earn your high school diploma

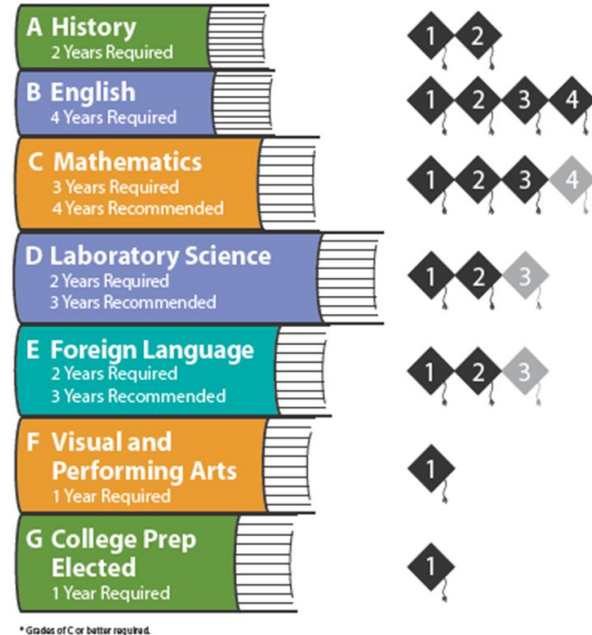
- Pass all classes that you are enrolled in (high school and college) to earn high school credits
- High school graduation requirements not offered during the school year on SOAR's campus
  - Health (10 credits) is taken in the summer before 9th grade
  - PE 2 (10 credits) is the summer before 10th grade
- 10 high school credits = 1 year of a high school course (5 credits per semester)
  - Any AVC course that is 3 or more units = 1 year of high school

# GRADUATION GOALS @ SOAR

## #2 - Complete your A-G requirements

- **These are course requirements you must complete in order to be eligible to go straight to a UC or CSU**
- **Two of these required subject are NOT offered on SOAR's campus and must be taken at AVC**
  - **E - Language other than English**
    - **2 years recommended of the same language**
    - **DO NOT take CHIN or LATN**
  - **F - Visual and Performing Arts**
- **C's or better are considered passing**
  - **The higher the better!**
  - **Must repeat D's & F's**
- **Remember: Each AVC course is like 1 year at a high school.**



# GRADUATION GOALS @ SOAR

## #3 or #4 or maybe not at all - Complete IGETC Requirements

- These are the AVC course requirements that may satisfy the general education requirements at a UC/CSU for a bachelor degree
- 2022-2023 IGETC Form

## #3 or #4 or maybe not at all - Complete AA Requirements

- These are the AVC courses that will satisfy the requirements to earn an Associates degree in the LAS: Arts & Humanities major
- 2022-2023 AA-Liberal Arts Science Requirements Sheet
- All SOAR Students are under the Arts & Humanities - Option III
