Course Description

The Creative Writing course is an elective course for the student wanting to master higher levels of a variety of specialized fiction and nonfiction writing genres. The course begins with a unit focusing on the creative writing process, which should remain open throughout the year, and culminates in a personal writing portfolio, which will likely play an important role for students who plan to pursue higher education (or a career) in the humanities.

Alternatively, the course can be differentiated for secondary-level intensive English students seeking graduation credits. There are no prerequisites to this course, so enrollment is open to all secondary students.

Mastery of the course requires the completion of ten units. There are five "Essential Units" and five "Selective Units", which are chosen by the teacher.

Course Grading

Assignment Grading

There are two types of assignments:

- 1) Formative assignments to help the student learn will be graded as "Complete" or "Incomplete"
- 2) Summative assignments that will be used to determine whether the student has= mastered the necessary skills for that unit. These will be marked as "A-level mastery" for those mastered at a high level, "B-level mastery" for those mastered at the standard level, or "Attempted" for those assignments submitted but not yet at the mastery level.

Unit Grading

Units are graded at A, B or D. An A or B will be based off of the rubrics at the start of each unit. A student may receive a D for a unit grade if they have plagiarized material (please read further on this in the QVS handbook) or if they have failed to show sufficient effort to complete the unit.

Grading Turn Around Times

My goal is to provide you with timely feedback on your work.

1) During the week, I will endeavor to provide feedback/grades within 24 hours.

2) If you submit an assignment Friday, over the weekend, or during a QVS break, I will return it after 24 hours of a working day. (Keep in mind that we may be in different time zones so this may impact when you receive feedback).

3) If you submit a large amount of work or many students happen to submit at the same time, this may not be possible. In this instance, I will communicate this fact with you and keep you updated on my progress on getting you feedback.

June Grading

Because Mastery Learning allows students to upgrade their work and, to some extent, work at their own pace, there may be opportunities to turn work in after the initial due date. However, in order to ensure that teachers can provide sufficient feedback and have time to grade all work before final grades are due, students may not complete more than 2 units in June.

Course content

Essential Units:

The tasks listed below are summative assignments. There will additionally be formative assignments throughout in order to help build the skills necessary to be successful.

E01 – The Writer's Notebook and Portfolio

Summative Assessments: Writer's notebook maintained throughout the year with reflections on the writing process

E02 – Fiction: Characterization

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various mentor texts, character study and excerpt using developed skills (this may be a complete short story, but is not necessarily required)

E03 – Fiction: Setting

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various mentor texts, excerpt using developed skills (this may be a complete short story, but is not necessarily required)

E04 – Fiction: Point of View, Structure and Audience

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various mentor texts, presentation comparing points of view in writing, a complete short story using skills from this and previous units

E05 – Poetry

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various mentor texts, a portfolio of poetry using a variety of poetry formats

Selective Units:

S01 – Scriptwriting

Summative Assessments: Analysis of one teacher-chosen script, analysis of studentchosen script, original one act stage play script

S02 – Copywriting

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various examples of copy, creation of three or more original pieces of copy

S03 – Graphic Narrative

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various mentor texts, original graphic narration of two or more pages (note that this will be graded for writing and not for artistic ability)

SO4 – Folk Literature

Summative Assessments: Analysis of various folk literature, analysis of folk literature from the student's home or host culture, original story emulating an example of folk literature with self-analysis (written or oral)

S08 – Portfolio/Project

Summative Assessments: Final portfolio/project from work throughout the year (this will include publishing and presentation choices)
