You are currently enrolled in a course at MTHS that may qualify for Dual Enrollment credit through Ocean County College.

Whether you have taken Dual Enrollment courses before or this is your first course that may qualify, most students have questions about Dual Enrollment.

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What is Dual Enrollment?

The Dual Enrollment or “Embedded” program offers high school students the opportunity to earn credits during their regular high school day. These courses are set up through articulation agreements between OCC and individual school districts. Each Embedded course meets the standards and curricular requirements of a college class taught at OCC and are taught by high school teachers possessing academic credentials that meet college adjunct requirements.

I plan on applying to 4 year schools- will those schools accept my Dual Enrollment credit?

It depends on the school you plan to attend after graduation. Contact the College or University's Admissions Office directly and ask if they accept Ocean County College credit at their school. Most in-state schools will accept the credit, even if it transfers as an elective.

What is the Cost of Dual Enrollment?

Effective Fall 2020, the tuition cost for Dual Enrollment courses is \$105 per credit.

Dual Enrollment courses do not qualify for Financial Aid.

Most courses are 3 credits with the exception of the Sciences (4 credits) and Calculus (4 credits)

How do I register for a Dual Enrollment course?

- In order to register for a Dual Enrollment course, you must complete the “Early College At The High School Registration Form” with your demographic information, student and parent signatures, and the fall and full year courses that you are enrolling in
- This form must then be returned to the Guidance Office by **Tuesday, September 13th**
- Failure to return this form by September 13th will prevent you from enrolling in your class as a Dual Enrollment Course

**** Please note- if you have never take a Dual Enrollment course before, you will need to complete an application for OCC at go.ocean.edu/earlycollege using your personal email address**

Can I drop my Dual Enrollment course?

If you would like to drop your Dual Enrollment course, you need to notify Ms. Solan immediately at ksolan@mtschoools.org. Ms. Solan will then notify OCC that you would like to drop the class. Classes must be dropped within the Add/Drop period in order for you to receive a refund. The Add/Drop schedule can be found on the OCC website.

What is Ocean Connect and will I have access to Ocean Connect after I am registered?

Ocean Connect is your online portal that allows you to access all of OCC's sites and services. You will be able to pay your bill, view the courses you are enrolled in, and access your grades after the course has been completed.

After you complete your application, OCC will generate a username and password for you:

Username: firstname_lastname

Password: OCC Student ID Number

How do I pay my bill?

Once you are registered, your bill will become available via Ocean Connect. After you are registered for your Dual Enrollment course, Ocean Connect will reflect your current balance due. It is the student/parent's responsibility to pay the bill upon enrollment. Paper bills will no longer be mailed home.

What happens if I do not pay the bill?

Even if you do not pay for your Dual Enrollment course, you will remain registered for the course. If you choose to drop your course before the Add/Drop period ends, you will no longer be registered for the course and will not be held financially responsible. If you do not pay your bill and do not drop the course, you will continue to have an outstanding balance with OCC and will not be able to request transcripts or register for any additional courses at a later time.

I have an IEP or 504- what is the process of rolling it over to the college level?

If you have an IEP or 504 and wish to use your accommodations in a Dual Enrollment course, you will need to complete the OCC Request for Accommodation Services form directly through OCC's website. If I apply to a 4 year school, will I apply as a new student or a transfer student?

You will still apply as a freshman or “first year” student. After you request your transcript from OCC, the Advising Office at that school will decide on additional course placement.

How do I send my Dual Enrollment grades to the schools I apply to?

You can request your transcript through the Records and Registration department via the OCC website. Any college you apply to will need an official transcript sent directly from OCC.
