COMMUNITY

Yellow Springs Exempted Village Schools consist of one elementary school and one high school with a school population of approximately 660. Yellow Springs High School is a comprehensive high school for grades 7 through 12. The high school has a small student/teacher ratio of 18:1. Our 11th and 12th grade students have the option of attending Greene County Career Center in Xenia, Ohio, which offers 25 different programs in trade, health, and business areas.

Yellow Springs (population - approximately 3,700) has a country setting, some 20 miles northeast of Dayton. Located in the village are Antioch College and several major industries, and Wright Patterson Air Force Base is 10 miles away. There are six colleges and universities within a 20-mile radius. A state reserve, state park and private nature reserve are all contiguous to Yellow Springs. Yellow Springs is a racially and culturally diverse community with enthusiastic individual participation in community affairs.

GRADING SYSTEM

Grades are issued on a 4-point scale (A=4; B=3; C=2; D=1). (A= 90-100, B=80-89, C=70-79, D=60-69, F=0-59). **Note:** Pluses and minuses may be optionally used by the teacher but are not regarded in calculating grade point averages. Grade point averages are computed based on full year course final averages. Junior and senior grade point averages are computed in January and June to determine eligibility for National Honor Society. Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, class rank is no longer reported, and valedictorian and salutatorian distinctions have been replaced with summa cum laude, magna cum laude, and cum laude designations.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students can choose from a wide variety of co-curriculars, including 13 varsity sports, band, orchestra, photography club, debate, School Forest, 3 yearly drama performances, student review board, yearbook, Gay/Straight Alliance, Spidee (Students Promoting Inclusion, Diversity and Equity in Education), and Project Charlie.





ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Yellow Springs High School offers AP classes in English Literature, Biology, Chemistry, Physics I, Calculus AB, US History, Seminar, Research and Studio Art

COMMUNITY SERVICE/SENIOR PROJECT

Students are required to complete fifteen hours of community service per year as a requirement for graduation. Seniors must complete and present for the school community a senior project highlighting an area of research or expertise, and including a service component.
