New Tardy Policy

Improving student attendance is an essential, costeffective but often overlooked strategy for ensuring our students are on-track to learn and succeed. To help improve overall academic achievement for students, Northeast High School is implementing a new Tardy Policy for the 2022-23 academic school year **effective September 6, 2022**.

- 1. Students that arrive <u>after 7:50 AM</u> will receive suitable consequences.
- 2. Students will be highlighted based on the number of offenses.
- Each student that comes into the attendance office will sign in with the Family and Community Engagement Liaison, Mr. Brown (A-L), and Home School Coordinator, Ms. Flores (M-Z).
- All students will be documented in the tardy attendance spreadsheet to monitor our students time and notes.

Highlighted in **BLUE** will be the students that have been late for the second time.

 Initial phone calls home will be made by either FaCE Liaison or HSC.

Highlighted in YELLOW will be the students that have been late for the third time.

 Another phone call home will be made by either FaCE Liaison or HSC.

Highlighted in **ORANGE** will be the students that have been late for the fourth time.

 One last phone call to the parent and 1:1 with the student.

Highlighted in RED will be the students that have been late for the fifth time.

 Administrator will follow up with these students and decide the disciplinary for the individual.

Disciplinary actions may include but are not limited to: Home Visit with Parents, 1:1 Check-ins, In School Suspension, Out of School Suspension, or loss of participation in sports and extracurricular activities.

A parent should notify the school office when a student is experiencing transportation issues to avoid consequences. Transportation issues will not be counted towards the new tardy attendance policy.
