Student Drop Off and Pick Up

Do you drop off or pick up your student in your personal vehicle? If you do, read on for some helpful tips to keep things moving smoothly!

-Students arriving in personal vehicles are to be dropped off and picked up in the gravel parking lot on the north side of our campus.

-Stay to the right side of your lane except to pass. If you have already dropped off or picked up, you are welcome to drive around other waiting vehicles so long as you can safely do so. Please do not stop in the passing lanes.

-Pull all the way forward in your lane to the front cones before stopping. This helps us get more cars through quicker.

-Be mindful that this is a very active parking lot. Always watch for students crossing!

-Use your turn signal early to help our parking lot helpers know what you intend to do and they can help keep traffic flowing.

Happy School Year and Welcome to Science!

All three science levels provide skills in our AVID strategies of Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.

6th, 7th, and 8th grade science classes will begin with lessons and assessments on Science Safety.

After Science Safety, 6th grade will begin covering the engineering standards with the PLTW module, Design and Modeling.

7th grade will begin lessons and activities on Atoms and Molecules and Magic of Electrons.

8th grade will begin lessons and activities for the cells Unit.

7th and 8th grade science classes are CTE, Career and Technical Education. These classes provide academic and technical skills for all students in preparation for high school pathways, and college and career readiness.

Wit & Wisdom

Wit & Wisdom is our English curriculum. It builds knowledge of key topics in history, science, and literature through the study of excellent texts. Wit & Wisdom is designed to challenge students in a positive and productive way, to build their knowledge of the world around them, and to hone the skills they need to be strong readers, critical thinkers, skilled writers, and excellent communicators. By reading and responding to stories and nonfiction texts, we will build knowledge of the following topics:

6th grade: Module 1: Resilience in the Great Depression

Core texts: Bud, Not Buddy, Christopher Paul Curtis Out of the Dust, Karen Hesse

Our classes will ask these questions:

What makes Bud a survivor?

What hardships did people face during the Great Depression?

How is Bud transformed by his journey?

What sustained people's spirits during the Great Depression?

How does hardship alter the characters' perspectives in Out of the Dust?

What makes the characters in Out of the Dust survivors?

How can enduring tremendous hardship contribute to personal transformation?

7th grade: Module 1: Identity in the Middle Ages

Core texts: Castle Diary, Richard Platt The Midwife's Apprentice, Karen Cushman The Canterbury Tales, Geoffrey Chaucer, retold by Geraldine McCaughrean

Our classes will ask these questions:

How does society influence identity and experience?

What do The Canterbury Tales reveal about identify and storytelling?

In The Midwife's Apprentice, how does the protagonist's identity change over time?

What elements make for an engaging historical narrative?

8th grade: Module 1: The Poetics of Storytelling

Core texts: *The Crossover,* Kwame Alexander

Our classes will ask these questions:

What shapes Josh Bell's sense of himself and his world?

How does form shape a story's meaning?

What is the role of expression in storytelling?

How do stories help us make sense of ourselves and the world?

What does it mean to be a storyteller?

Student and Parent Contract

All Marcus Whitman students will be issued a Chromebook with the goals of:

- Increased opportunities for collaboration, communication and creativity
- Increased student engagement in a personalized learning environment
- Improved access to both teacher content and robust internet resources to foster acquisition of knowledge and skills

The Chromebook is first and foremost an educational device. It is essential that this agreement be followed to ensure the safe, efficient, and ethical operation of these devices.

SKSD retains sole right of possession of the Chromebook and related equipment (AC adapter, power cord and carrying case). There is no expectation of privacy in use or data stored on the district-owned device. The SKSD Acceptable Use policy is in effect.

Handling, Care & Use:

- You are always responsible for your own Chromebook.
- You should never share your personal login information, or let any other student use your Chromebook.
- Make sure you start each school day with a fully charged battery on your Chromebook.
- Handle the Chromebook with great care.
- Do not throw, slide, drop, toss, etc. the Chromebook.
- Do not carry or hold the Chromebook in the air by the screen/display.
- Do not close the device with any items resting on the keyboard.
- Do not store items in your case, it is meant to ONLY hold your device.
- Always place your Chromebook into its protective case before moving to your next class.
- Your Chromebook should be used for school purposes only.
- Do not access, store, create, consume, or share unauthorized or inappropriate content with your Chromebook.
- You should not eat or drink near your Chromebook.
- Heavy objects should never be placed or stacked on top of your Chromebook. This includes books, musical instruments, sports equipment, etc.
- Do not write on or decorate your Chromebook.
- Do not remove identification labels or tags placed on your Chromebook by district personnel.
- If your Chromebook is not working properly or is in need of repair, please notify Mrs. Chang im mediately and bring it to the library at the first opportunity. Email: <u>chang@skschools.org</u> Phone: 360-874-6175




