Founded in 1905, **The Savannah Country Day School** is an independent, coeducational college preparatory school with a student population of 1,124, ranging from our early childhood program to grade 12. The campus is located on 65 wooded acres on the south side of Savannah near the Vernon River. Students are admitted to Country Day on the basis of academic record, test scores, recommendations, and an interview. Last year Country Day awarded \$2.8M in financial aid to 226 students.



Savannah Country Day students are limited to nine AP courses. Students may enroll in a maximum of one AP course as a sophomore, four as a junior and four as a senior. There are no exceptions to this policy.



CLASS OF 2022

100% of the graduates matriculated to four-year colleges. The 95 members of the class of 2022 submitted 615 applications, 58% of which were successful at 98 institutions in 33 states, the District of Columbia, Canada, and Europe.

DISCIPLINE REPORTING POLICY

It is the policy of The Savannah Country Day School to share a student's disciplinary history with regards to suspensions emanating from either discipline or honor offenses incurred on our campus *if requested*. For colleges and universities that require acknowledgement of criminal infractions, we will provide that information as well *if we are aware of these incidents*.

ACADEMIC LIFE UNDER COVID

In March 2020 we shuttered our doors and transitioned to online learning; our synchronous and asynchronous virtual curriculum maintained the rigor and scholarship long associated with The Savannah Country Day School. We began the 2020-2021 school year under a cohort system in which one half of the upper school attended classes on campus one week followed by the other cohort on campus the next week. Our remote students continued to attend their classes via Zoom while at home. After approximately six weeks, we invited all students to return to campus for instruction; however, a number of our students remained remote learners for the entire year due to health concerns.

FACULTY

Of the 46 Upper School faculty members, 36 hold advanced degrees in their fields. Nearly all teachers serve as academic advisors and many coach and/or sponsor on-campus clubs and activities. The average teaching experience is 15 years.

GPA

The Savannah Country Day transcript indicates both a raw cumulative average and a weighted cumulative average; the latter includes three points added to Honors classes, and five points added to all AP and Advanced (Adv.) classes for GPA calculation. These bonus points are not added to semester course grades; they are only included for weighted cumulative average calculations. Only those grades earned in courses taken at Country Day or through the Global Online Academy are included in each cumulative average. Country Day does not rank its students.

FINE ARTS AT SCDS

Savannah Country Day is proud of its robust Fine Arts program and facilities that includes a 400-seat theater, band and strings rooms, and fully-equipped 2D and 3D art studios. The Fine Arts curriculum includes: Art 101/102, Drawing and Painting, Ceramics, Digital Photography, Art Portfolio, Digital 3D Design, Art and Design, Chorus, Introduction to Theatre, Acting Ensemble, Music Appreciation, Music Tech, AP Music Theory, Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combo, and Strings Ensemble.

GLOBAL ONLINE ACADEMY (GOA)

The Savannah Country Day School became a member institution of the GOA in 2016. The mission of this consortium of the world's leading independent schools is to translate into online classrooms the intellectually rigorous programs and excellent teaching that are hallmarks of its select member schools. Country Day is one of only six GOA member schools in the state of Georgia and all courses are taught by GOA member school faculty. GOA courses are clearly indicated on student transcripts and included in cumulative GPA calculations.

THE INSTITUTE FOR ATLANTIC STUDIES

The Institute for Atlantic Studies (IAS) was born in spring 2021 by a group of upper school faculty from diverse academic backgrounds who wanted to create an interdisciplinary vehicle to promote both scholarship about and community engagement within our historic city and region, using Savannah as a lens through which to study the wider Atlantic world. The IAS not only promotes the inclusion of Atlantic studies across disciplines, it also hosts the Atlantic Institute Seminar, a year-long elective course available on application to students in grades 10-12. The IAS director leads this course and these students will explore topics of interest throughout the year culminating in a capstone research-based project each spring. The IAS encourages learning and teaching beyond traditional boundaries and we feel it will become a signature program for our school emphasizing the principles of place-based learning and capitalizing on our unique location.

Upper School Curriculum

The core curriculum at SCDS requires students to complete a rigorous and diverse course of study which prepares them for highly challenging, college-level work. Honors, Advanced, and Advanced Placement classes offer demanding curricular choices, while our elective options permit students to diversify their range of selections, and at the same time, explore their interests. **AP courses are capped at nine with individual caps by year, provided below. AP, Advanced courses and 600 level courses receive a five point weight.** Honors courses provide a three point weight. This weight is included in the cumulative weighted GPA provided on the transcript, but individual grades remain unweighted. Bolded courses are considered the most rigorous in the discipline.
