SOPHOMORE TO-DO LIST: 2017 - 2018

1. Keep Your Grades Up.

Colleges view your GPA as the most important factor in your application, and tenth grade is especially important. No Ds or Fs! If you are having problems in a class, GET HELP. Talk to your teacher about tutoring, and come to the College/Career Center for Peer Tutoring every morning @ 7:30.

2. Commit Yourself to Extracurriculars.

Think about ways you can contribute to both the school and the larger community. Think about the skills you possess and ways in which you can utilize them. Don't just join clubs: make them better! Accept responsibility and demonstrate leadership.

3. Study your personal PSAT Score Report and utilize all of the College

Board Resources to improve your skills and scores! We will be bringing all **Sophomore English classes to the Library early next semester to explain how to use the information.** When you receive your scores, look specifically at **Your Scores: Next Steps;** then go to <u>studentscores.collegeboard.org</u> for SAT Practice, AP & Course Work. You will get a **PRESCRIPTION,** based on your test results, that will take you to Khan Academy for instruction and practice to improve your skills. Utilize the resources available through the College Board.

4. Seize Opportunities to Learn About Colleges.

Visit local colleges, and attend College Representatives' meetings at BCCHS if your teachers allow. (Sign up in College/Career Center and get a pass from your classroom teacher.)

5. Seek Opportunities to Explore Careers.

After you complete the career assessment this year, research career paths that interest you. Talk to people working in those fields, and check out the educational requirements to pursue those careers.

6. Examine Your Transcript.

What's missing? How can you strengthen your record? If you have any Ds or Fs in core classes (A thru G), see your 10th grade counselor about retaking those classes.

7. Plan Your Courses for Junior Year.

Think about AP and Honors classes for which you <u>qualify</u>. Plan to take Math next year.

8. Plan Your Summer.

Do something rewarding and meaningful next summer, so start planning <u>now</u>. Attend Summer School if needed, and start preparing for your all-important Junior year. Read, read, read; and make yourself aware of the world and your place in it.

9. Take SAT Subject Tests in May or June.

The best time for Subject tests is at the completion of a course (especially an AP course), so take the SAT Subject Tests (three one-hour tests of your choice) in May or June. If you receive free/reduced lunch, you are entitled to two Subject test sessions – for free.
