


Bond Committee Purpose and Charge

New Braunfels ISD encompasses 75 square miles in Comal and Guadalupe Counties



Current Land Use






DemographicsProjected Growth in NBISD - Housing

 - Carl Schurz, County Line, Klein Road, Lamar, Memorial, Seele, Veramendi, Voss Farms, Walnut Springs
- 2 Middle School Campuses Grades 6-8
 - New Braunfels Middle School, Oak Run Middle School
- Ninth Grade Center Grade 9
- New Braunfels High School Grades 10-12
- Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP)
- School of Choice (Credit Recovery)

Facility Construction and Changes in the 2018 Bond

- The "New" New Braunfels Middle School is under construction on Settler's Crossing and Klein Road and will open in August 2021
- The current New Braunfels Middle School will become the Ninth Grade Center/Future 2nd High School and will open in August 2021
- The current Ninth Grade Center will be demolished and a new elementary school will be built in it's place to accommodate both Carl Schurz and Seele Elementary Schools to open in Fall 2023
- 8 Additional Classrooms have been added to Veramendi Elementary
- Carl Schurz will be repurposed for DAEP, SOC and future district services
- No decision has been made on disposition of Seele



Factors Determining Split to Two High Schools

- The split to 2 high schools will be based on enrollment
 - The target for the split is 3,000 students
 - This would equate to approximately 1,500 students per high school
- State funding is based on Average Daily Attendance
- State funding as well as local funding would be "split" between the two high schools when a second high school is opened
- There is no additional state funding for operating a 2nd high school and local tax revenue does not increase
- We have projected that it takes 1,500 students to fund the programs we currently have in place at New Braunfels High School
- To split sooner would require the district to cut some of the programs that our current high school has



Steps to Second High School

- August 2021 Ninth Grade center relocated to current NBMS
 - Remain a Ninth Grade Center until conversion begins
 - Estimated three years through 2023-2024 school year
- The campus will be ready to begin conversion to 2nd high school when enrollment dictates
- The conversion will be a three year plan
- Projected plan for second high school
 - 1st Year 9th and 10th grades estimated 2024-2025
 - 2nd Year 9th, 10th, 11th grades estimated 2025-2026
 - 3rd Year First year of 9-12 grade high school estimated 2026-2027
- Based on our projected enrollment growth, we envision conversion to a 2nd high school to be complete by 2026-2027




Completion of Second High School

- The current NBMS facility was designed and built as the First Half of the Second High School
 - Core areas cafeteria, library, etc. were built to 2,200 capacity
 - The instructional area was built to accommodate 1,250 students as a middle school
 - Conversion to a second high school will require a bond election to fund:
 - An additional 950 seat capacity of instructional classrooms will need to be added
 - Additional fine arts space will be needed
 - Additional athletic spaces will be needed
 - Career and technology classrooms and labs will be needed
 - Additional parking will be needed



Location of NBISD High Schools **



- ** It is estimated that a third high school and a third middle school are at least 19 years out based on 3% annual enrollment growth.
- *** Future roadways and housing development are factors that will be considered at that time.
- ** These potential attendance zones are based on existing roadways and with zero splitting of neighborhoods based on current conditions.
- **Attendance zones for New Braunfels High School and the third high school will be decided by the board at that time.



New Elementary School and Renovations 2018 Facilities Committee Recommendations

Need to bring elementary campuses into 21st Century Schools

- Concerns with age of Carl Schurz, Seele and Lamar
- Recommended new campuses be built instead of remodels
 - Increase capacity to that of Klein, Veramendi and Voss
 - Current campus sites not feasible due to limited acreage
- Recommended new campus be built on current Ninth Grade Center Site to combine Carl Schurz and Seele attendance zones
 - This campus is included in the 2018 bond
 - Will be completed by August, 2023



New Elementary School and Renovations 2018 Facilities Committee Recommendations

- Recommended remodeling work at County Line, Memorial and Walnut Springs
 - This was included in the 2018 bond
- Recommended a second elementary campus be constructed in Veramendi
 - Accommodate growth in Western half of district
 - Replace Lamar Elementary with additional capacity
