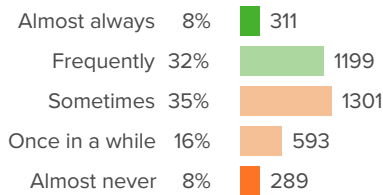

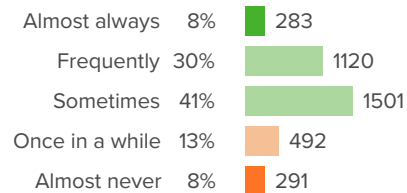
Q.1: How often do teachers encourage you to learn about people from different races, ethnicities, or cultures?

Favorable: **41%**

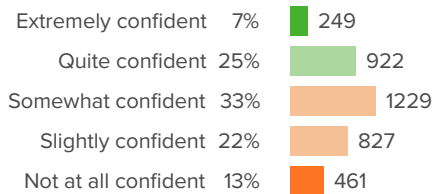
Q.2: How often do you think about what someone of a different race, ethnicity, or culture experiences?

Favorable: **79%**

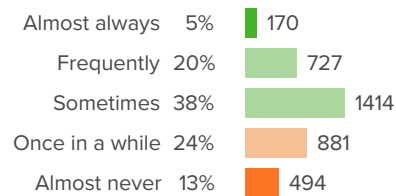
Q.3: How confident are you that students at your school can have honest conversations with each other about race?

Q.4: At your school, how often are you encouraged to think more deeply about race-related topics?

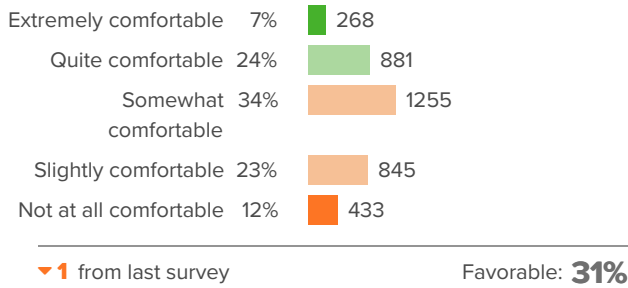

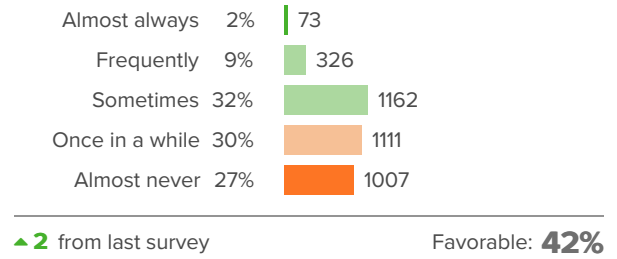

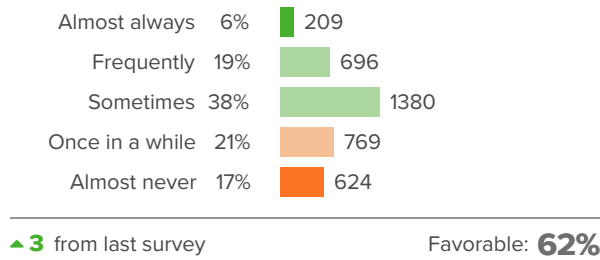
Q.5: How comfortable are you sharing your thoughts about race-related topics with other students at your school?
